Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of December 4 and those

of the special meeting of December 20 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended and Bob Torgerson and F.G. McNamee, being present bro't up the matter of their garbage collecting contract. They stated that it seemed impossible to make sufficient collections to justify continuing and suggested that the City take over or some other plan be worked out.

After some discussion it was decided that this matter should be handled by a special committee and the Mayor appointed Messrs. Anderson, Hill and Cutsforth to try and work out some solution.

In Supt. Raines' oral report, he recommended the purchase of five 25's transformers at this time, as it might be difficult to find them on the market later. The matter was left to Councilman Girod to act.

Raines also called the attention of the Council to the fact that the City needed another supply of water and that we might have trouble next

summer, if a dry season should prevail.

He also recommended that Don Stajgr be placed on a flat wage of \$ 250.

per month and Lawrence Graham and Carl Rhodes be raised to 1.25 per hour.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded and carried that Stajgr be paid as above and that Graham and Rhodes be advanced to 1.10 per hour. Raines then suggested that his own salary should be increased and it appearing that Mrs. Decker and Chief Hudson had similar ideas as to their

own stipend, a committee composed of Anderson, Hill and Girod was appointed to investigate salaries and wages and make recommendations.

Mayor Irwin also instructed the Recorder to write the office of the League of Oregon Cities for information as to salaries paid by other cities of comparable size for positions like that of Supt. Raines.

Chief Hudson then reported having contacted quite a few property

owners in the matter of outside toilets and that most of them had complied with the terms of the ordinance recently passed.

Mayor Irwin then stated that the old Building Code ordinance passed many years ago, apparently did not meet the conditions now prevailing and that he would appoint a committee for the purpose of working up one that would be more appropriate at this time.

Messrs. Anderson, Kraft and Hill were then appointed as this committee. No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
