Rei ar Meeting Monday, March 5-1951

The Council met in regular session on Monday, March 5-1951 and was called to order at 5.15, but no quorum being present, Mayor Irwin announced that an adjournment would be made to Thursdaym March 8.

Thursday, March 8-1951

The adjourned meeting was held on the above date and called to order at 8.10 P/M/ Present: Mayor Irwin, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen

Anderson, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Febr. 5 and the special of Febr. 21 were read and approved.

Communications

From Chas. Dunn, District Manager, B.P.A. stating that the Federal Power Commission had approved the new contract with Canby, which grants an extension of one year to December 31-1951, electric power to be supplied under the provisions of the E-4 Rate Schedule.

From A.L.Beck, Supt, of Schools asking that a center line be painted at the Buchanan-Cellers corner, to aid the busses in making the turn.

Various letters by Segnator Howard Belton and Rep. Crosby to and from the State Highway Commission relative to the proposed new light for 99E and Molalla Avenue and stating that cost of installation must be on a 50-50 basis.

From Representatives Henry Semon, Roy L. Houck and David C. Baum, acknowledging receipt of our letters urging passage of law allocating to cities 10% of net liquor revenues.

From Miss Loa Howard, Adm. of the State Public Welfare Commission, relative to the participation of municipal employees in the Fedaral Old Age insurance program and stating that H.B. 376 had been introduced as an enabling act.

Reports of officers

Chief of Police Hudson submitted his usual report for the preceding month, showing arrests made, assistance given to state police, the sheriff's office, aid to motorists and various other minor matters.

The Recorder reported 14 cases in his Court in February resulting in fines assessed amounting to \$ 262.50-Costs \$ 55.00.

Fire Chief reported one rural fire at Barlow on Febr. 24, with loss of about \$ 500. Two minor fires in the City-no damage to mention.

Supt. Raines reported having purchased considerable wire and that more transformers were needed-about 18 or 20. in order to have plenty on hand. Stated that only one firm in Portland had a supply available.

Mayor Irwin then stated that the Quonset hut was badly in need of painting and on motion, seconded and carried this was ordered done.

Miscellaneous

The application of Earl Oliver for permission to open a forty foot street on his new addition, formerly the Hampton property was unfavor-

ably received by the Council.

Relative to the installation of a new traffice light at 99E and Molalla Avehue, it was moved by Girod, seconded by Hill and carried, that the Recorder be instructed to inform the Highway Commission that it was the desire of the Council that the light be installed as soon as possible, with the understanding that the cost would be met in accordance with their rules and regulations.

In the Sather estate matter, the Recorder was asked to secure photostatic copies of entire report of the Executor, showing disposition of the personal property of the deceased.

The garbage collecting problem then came up, an application hawing been received from John Bloom and Son, who operate in Oregon City and Molalla. This concern offered to pay the city \$ 50.00 a year for the concession. No action was taken, as it was thought best to first come to an understanding with Torgeson and McNamee.

The request of John Koehler that an exemption from taking out and paying for a permit be allowed in connection with the erection of a building for the Evangelical church was turned down, as it was thought a bad precident would be established.

It appearing that complaints were still coming in as to conditions surrounding the Meek's Poultry Farm, Councilman Kraft agreed to work with Chief Hudson and try and do something about it.

The report of Auditor Wilson was then read and accepted by the Council. This report of the financial condition of the City covered the period from July 1, 1950 to January 1-1951 and was requested on account of the change in the office of City Treasurer.

Mayor Irwin then stated that at this time, he would appoint two new members of the Budget Committee to replace those whose terms had expired. Messrs. Eversole and John Pond were appointed and the Com. now is as follows:
