Re clar Monthly Meeting Menday, May 7-1951

The Council met in regular session on Monday, May 7 and was called

to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, the Recorder, Supt. Raines and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, and Kraft. Absent-Rupp. The minutes of the previous meetings of April 2 and 9th. were read and approved.

Communications

From S.P. Co. stating that stock cars will hereafter be cleaned on old gravel pit track.

From S.I.A.C. that ambulance operators are covered same as firemen. From County Board of Health asking that the City contribute towards the expense of maintaining health service in the county.

Petition.

A petition for the improvement of at least three blocks on N.E. Third Avenue was then presented to the Council, asking for oiling and Graveling in order to gain relief from annoying dust and dirt arising from the present surface conditions.

The petition was signed by over thirty citizens affected by the

above mentioned conditions, many of whom were present

Supt. Raines then stated that the City did not have sufficient funds to build streets or keep them in proper repair and could see no relief unless property owners were willing to stand the expense.

After a lengthy discussion in which several of the petitioners took part, it was moved by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the City attorney be instructed to draw and ordinance, calling for the improvement of three blocks on N.E. Third Avenue, the cost of which to be assessed against the property owners on a pro rata frontfoot basis.

Mr. E. H. Thornton then addressed the Council, asking if something could not be done about opening 6th. avenue from Grant to Elm street. It being necessary to include a strip owned by S/D 86, to accomplish this purpose, the Recorder was instructed to contact the school board and arrange for a meeting with that body.

Whereupon Bob Torgeson presented anewly drawn up garbage contract to the Council for their approval, which however, did not appear to be entirely satisfactory and it was decided to let the old contract continue, with the understanding that he be allowed to make some changes in his rates and that the dump must be kept in good condition.

Surveyor Sperb, speaking on behalf of Tom Oliver then asked the Council for their approval for an extension of Wait Avenue to Ferry Road and No. Ivy to Wait Avenue, which request was granted.

It was then moved, seconded and carried, that a floral piece be ordered for the funeral of Laurin Hudson and the Recorder was asked to send a letter of condolence as coming from the members of the City Council.

Reports

Supt. Raines reported that it would require about 800 feet of fencing for the city dump and pole yard at a cost of \$ 45 per 100 feet for fencing similar to that surrounding the fair grounds or \$ 24 per 100 for common fencing.

On motion by Girod, seconded by Hill and carried, it was voted

to use the better grade.

Fire Chief Yoder reported six rural district calls in April, resulting in about \$ 900 losses .

He also stated that the annual firemen's convention would be held in Portland on June 7-8-9 and in this connection it was moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that \$ 150 be allowed for expenses of the members of the department who desired to attend.

The Recorder reported five cases held in his court during April,

resulting in fine of \$ 50.50, costs \$ 12.50.

The need of a new police car was then discussed but no action except that it was agreed to present the matter to the budget meeting. Mayor Irwin then announced that the Council would meet with the

Budget Committee on Friday, May 11.
