

Special Meeting
Friday, May 11-1951

The Council having just adjourned from meeting with the Budget Committee, was called together in special session, with all members present.

Whereupon it was moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the 1951-52 budget as set up by the committee be accepted, published in the Canby Herald in their issues of May 17 and 24 and that June 8 be designated as a date for public hearing.

The following resolution was then introduced and on motion, seconded declared adopted:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS: The budget committee for the City of Canby has found it necessary, owing to the increased cost in operating the City government, especially the fire and police departments, to recommend a tax levy over and above the levy of 1950-51 plus the 6% increase allowed by Section 2, Article 11 of the Constitution of Oregon - now
BE IT RESOLVED, THAT a special election be called as of June 12, 1951 to vote whether or not the said tax levy shall be increased by the sum of \$ 3115.00.

ORDINANCE-363

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE OILING OF THIRD AVENUE BETWEEN IVY STREET AND LOCUST STREET IN THE CITY OF CANBY OREGON; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT AGAINST THE PROPERTIES BENEFITED BY SUCH OILING.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above Ordinance was passed on it's first reading, ordered published and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the City Council to be held on Monday, June 4, 1951.
