Reports of Officers

Chief of Police Hudson presented his usual monthly report, which was read by the Recorder. This report covered in detail as to assistance given, complaints received and investigated, arrests made and various other matters.

The Recorder reported 30 cases in his court in June, resulting in fines assessed and collected in the amount of \$ 293.50, costs \$ 73.50. Also total fines from July 1-1949 to June 30-1950 amounted to \$ 3457.00-costs \$ 855.00.

Fire Chief Yoder reported no fires in June; also announced that a meeting of the County Firemen's Association would be held in Canby on July 17, at which time principal matters to be taken up would be those of civil defense. Everybody invited.

In connection with fire matters, Councilman Kraft stated that the rural district directors favored the suggestions previously made as to construction of new building for equipment.

With reference to this, it was the opinion of the council members that the RFD should prepare and submit a definite proposal in detail, before an Ordinance could be drawn for the purpose of calling a special election. Left in the hands of Messrs. Irwin, Kraft and Atty. Zimmerman.

Supt. Raines reported that the new truck for the Light Dept. would be delivered in Canby by Sam's Garage.

Also that balance of street light equipment had been received and some already installed.

It was then moved by Porter, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to sign new Bonneville contract.

It was also moved by Porter, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the P.G.E. plan No. 2, showing proposed new sub-station locations and lines be accepted and P.G.E. so notified.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Irwin and carried, that the Allis-Chalmers grader, (previously demonstrated and priced by salesman, Sam Selker) be purchased, subject to approval of agreement by the council. Basic price \$ 5697.00, with an allowance of \$ 300 for old grader and less \$ 250 and \$ 15 , providing cab and wiper are not included.

It was then moved by Porter of the finance committee, and seconded by Kraft and carried, that the firm of Piepenbrink and Krohn be employed to again audit the books.

Councilman Kraft then reported that the police car radio was out-moded and the car had no service. By motion, seconded and carried, the matter of replacement was left to the police committee.

ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 360 regulating the erection, or construction, or maintenance of outside toilets or privies then came up for final action. On roll call-Yeas 4 nays 0. Passed and so ordered.

ORDINANCE NO. 361 levying a tax of \$ 5775.00 on all taxable property, both real and personal within the corporate limits of Canby, passed and so ordered. Yeas 4-nays 0.

Supt. Raines then asked that the matter of a new desk for the front office and the changes as previously discussed, be taken up at this time and Councilman Porter promised to give it attention.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
