

Regular Meeting
Monday, August 7-1950

The Council met in regular session on Monday, August 7 and was called to order at 8:30 P.M.

Present and answering roll call: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, the Recorder, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson and Councilmen Anderson, Irwin, Kraft, Porter. Councilman Beck reported later and Rupp absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July 3 were read and approved. Mayor Eversole then announced that the regular order of business would be suspended and visitors heard.

Whereupon Mrs. A. H. Knight, Mrs. Martha Scheer and Fred Stefani, speaking as landlords stated that they were asking for relief from rent control, wishing to know the sentiment of the Council and if anything could be done in the matter.

Atty. Zimmerman stated that it would be necessary to present a written petition to the Council, which if acted on favorably would then be presented to the Governor, who had sole power to act.

The Mayor then said that if such a petition should be presented, he would call a special meeting to consider the same.

City Treasurer Eid then submitted his report for the quarter ending June 30 and also for the month of July, which on motion, seconded and carried, were accepted subject to audit by the Finance committee.

Mr. Wilkinson of the Wilkinson Lumber Co. then addressed the Council, stating that he had urgent need for three more transformers at the mill, as those now installed were heavily overloaded and it was not possible to operate the mill on full time. He also said that his company did not feel financially able, at the present time, to warrant the necessary expenditure and asked that the City finance the matter, at least for any cost over \$ 1500. After considering the above, it was left to Messrs. Raines and Porter to solve this problem.

The Council members then gave their attention to the question of the feeder line from the proposed new sub-station of the P.G.E. to the city's load center. Mr. Chas. Dunn from the Bonneville Power Administration, together with Messrs. Johnson, Curts and Lampson from the P.G.E. Company were present, all joining in the ensuing discussion.

Mr. Johnson explained that his company had offered to build and maintain the line, or would build and let the City keep it up, that is, the portion within the city limits.

Supt. Raines thought that the portion of line in the City should be owned and maintained by Canby and also suggested that the Company build it and turn it over to the City for free.

Mr. Johnson stated that he had no authority to make a deal of that nature and it was finally decided to make a proposal by letter to the P.G.E. setting forth what Canby would prefer in the matter.

Communications

From Oregon City announcing a Civilian Defense meeting to be held August 9 in the Court House. (Defense Chairman should be appointed)

From County Health Dept. enclosing recommendations for sanitary precautions to be used by cities and individuals.

From R.H.Baldock, State Highway Engineer stating that F.B.Urandall Traffic Engineer would confer with the City relative to traffic light.

From State Fire Marshall relative to Scramlin building and enclosing copy of his order dated Dec. 28-1948. No action taken, as Chief Yoder expected to contact inspector within next few days and would report.

Ordinance

Ordinance No. 362, establishing a Local Defense Organization and authorizing the Mayor to appoint a Director of Civil Defense for the City of Canby, was then introduced, read, passed on first reading and to come up for final action, after first being duly posted in accordance with the manner prescribed, on Tuesday, September 5, 1950, the date of the next regular meeting of the City Council of Canby.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the bid of the Wood Tractor Co. for the Allis-Chalmers grader (only bid presented) be accepted.

Petitions.

A petition for the oiling of North Ivy street between 6th. and Virginia and signed by numerous property owners interested was then presented to the Council. It was claimed, that owing to the present condition of the street, their homes were being damaged by dust and other matters and immediate relief was asked.

The following bills and claims were then presented and on motion, seconded and carried, ordered paid and warrants drawn:
