The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, Sept. 5,

the first Monday being a legal hoilday.

The meeting was called to order at 8.15 P.M., with the following present and answering roll call: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Iswin, Porter and Rupp. Beck and Kraft reported later.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of August 7, the adjourned meeting of August 15 and the special meetings of the 17th and 21st were

read and approved.

The order of business was then suspended and the Council listened to the report of Mr. Wilson, who had recently finished the audit of the City's books. Mr. Wilson reported the books and accounts in excellent shape and recommended only a few minor changes.

The application of Verne D. Heath for the privilege of operating an automobile wrecking yard (formerly Crosson) was then presented to the Council, and on motion, seconded and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to approve the same.

The Mayor then announced that he had asked Ralph Milln, the city engineer to be present to join in a discussion of the proposed sewer project and with the idea of presenting the matter to a vote of the citizens in the near future. After a prolonged discussion it was decided to meet again on Wednesday, Sept. 13 and the Recorder was asked to contact the engineering firm at Corvallis, requesting that one of their members attend, if possible. Mr. Milln, also stated that he would get in touch with C.E.Stewart, District Engineer of the Federal Works Agency and ask him to be present.

Mayor Eversole then announced that the proposal of the Rural Fire District, relative to the erection of a new fire station in Canby had been withdrawn and at present the matter was at a standstill.

Reports

Fire Chief Yoder reported one city call and two mutual aid calls in August with no damage resulting. Four rural calls, brush and stubble fires-no damage. Also from July 1 to Sept. 1, the Ambulance answered 13 calls and had received in contributions and donations, the sum of \$ 93.00. Expenses for gas, etc. amounted to \$ 31.12.

The Recorder reported 17 cases in his court during the month, with fines assessed in the amount of \$ 167.50-costs \$ 40.50.

Supt. Raines reported all city street lights now installed. He also warned the Council as to the water situation and while the biggest demand for the season was apparently over, provision should be made for the future demands.

He also stated that Tony Ott was about to leave as an employee of the City, having been inducted into the armed service, and asked for vacation allowance of two weeks. It was the opinion of the Council that Ott should be allowed one week and so ordered.

Kendall stated that a movement had been started to have an "Al Lien Day" the latter part of the month, when his team played in Portland.
