

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, Octo.2-1950

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, October 2, 1950 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, the Recorder, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Irwin, Porter and Rupp. Absent Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting and those of the special meetings of Sept. 13 and 19th were read and approved.

Communications

From Oregon Assn. of Police Chiefs calling attention to their annual basic training schools to be held this fall.

From Charles Dunn, District Manager, B.P.A. relative to the transmission line from the proposed new P.G.E. substation to the load center in Canby, which the Company would build and maintain.

Mr. Dunn stated that he thought the City should prepare a formal agreement covering the different problems of maintenance and operation of the line, so that everything would be definite regarding these arrangements. Bonneville should be furnished with a copy of same.

Reports of Officers

Chief of Police Hudson presented his monthly statement of his various activities in detail.

The Recorder reported 14 cases in his court during the month, with resulting fines of \$ 137.50-Costs \$ 34.00.

Fire Chief Yoder reported two grass fires, no damage; also two calls for grass fires in rural district, with no damage.

Yoder asked for installation of two flood lights to light the ramp entrance to fire station to enable the men to see better in cleaning up the trucks at night.

In connection with this, on motion by Irwin, seconded by Beck and carried, Supt. Raines was instructed to install two lights at entrance to fire station.

Councilman Kraft then stated that it would probably be advisable to appoint a new night policeman soon and that he had received an application from Lloyd D. Younce. There being no objection, the matter was left in Mr. Kraft's hands.

Ordinance No. 362

Ordinance No. 362, establishing a local organization for Civil Defense and authorizing the Mayor to appoint a Director of same then came up for final action and on motion, seconded and carried declared adopted- On roll call Yeas 5-nays 0.

Atty. Zimmerman then presented copies of ordinances passed by the cities of Beaverton and Junction City relative to installation of sewers and elections to vote special taxes for same.

After some discussion, Mr. Zimmerman recommended that a special meeting be called to again take up the matter, and it was decided to adjourn and meet on Thursday evening, October 5.
