

Special Meeting
Thursday, Octo. 6-1950

A special meeting of the Council was held on Thursday, October 6 for the purpose of considering the procedure to follow in legal matters pertaining to the proposed sewerage system, it apparently necessitating an ordinance or ordinances amending the city charter.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and all councilmen.

Atty. Zimmerman announced that he had in hand, ordinances passed by the cities of Beaverton and Junction in connection with their sewage matter, and these were read to the Council.

After discussion, it was moved by Beck, seconded by Porter, that the Mayor appoint a committee to work with the City Attorney in formulating an ordinance calling for a charter amendment for the above purpose. This was carried and Messrs. Porter, Rupp and Kraft were then appointed.

Councilman Kraft then stated that he had several applications asking for the night police job; some from outside and two from local people.

The application of Loyd D. Younce seemed to be the most favorable, but the matter was left for Mr. Kraft's decision. (Younce appointed and sworn in later.)

Councilman also stated that extra salary was due Chief Hudson, as he had worked put in considerable overtime pending the selection of a new night man. This also was left to Mr. Kraft to consult with Hudson and arrive at a satisfactory amount.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
