

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, Dec. 4-1950

The Council met in regular session on Monday, Dec. 4 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Irwin, Kraft and Porter. Absent-Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of November 6 and those of the special meeting of November 9 were read and approved.

Communications.

The Recorder read a letter from Deane Seeger, Consultant for the League of Oregon Cities, it being an answer to our request that he pass on the copy of the proposed charter amendment authorizing the construction of a sewer system and treatment plant for Canby.

Mr. Seeger had some suggestions to make, but very little criticism and his letter has been placed in the files of the sewer matter.

Mayor Eversole then announced that the regular order of business would be suspended and the Council would listen to Harold Henry and Gordon Weygandt, who, it appeared were representing the Recreation Commission.

Mr. Henry stated that, owing to the lack of interest in activities for which the Quonset Hut had been purchased and located on the Park block owned by the City, an embarrassing condition had arisen, chiefly of a financial nature. He urged that the City take over the Hut and assume the liability, which amounted to \$ 525.00. He stated that over \$ 2000 had been raised and used in financing the project and there was no debt other than this \$ 525.00, which was represented by bonds or notes due the following:

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed. On roll call, Yeas 5-nays 0

Mayor Eversole then stated that he had a talk recently with School Supt. Beck regarding the title to the street or part of the same in front of the High School. It appearing that one of the Geo. Brown heirs seemed unwilling to sign a deed dedicating the street to the City, Mr. Beck thought or suggested that condemnation proceedings might be commenced if the council saw fit. The Mayor suggested that the members have this matter in their minds for possible future action.

Reports of Officers .

Chief Hudson's report contained the usual items of matters connected with his activities, with no unusual happenings.

The Recorder reported 14 cases handled in his Court during the month, resulting with fines aggregating \$ 255.00, costs \$ 56.00

The Fire Chief reported two fires in the City, no damage resulting.

Three flue fires in the rural district-no damage. Dwelling north of Canby totally destroyed with furniture, loss estimated \$ 5500. Partial insurance.

Councilman Anderson reported that he had contacted a Mr. Crawford, who was familiar with the operation of road machinery and thought it might be good business to hire him.

Whereupon it was moved by Beck, seconded by Irwin that this man be taken on trial beginning January first.

Councilman Beck reported not having yet contacted the City Atty. in the matter of drawing an ordinance relative to garbage collections.

He also thought that the City engineer or a surveyor should make a study of the streets, having in mind future possible extensions or openings, so that hereafter no buildings should be erected blocking such possible extensions or openings.

Mr. Beck furthermore suggested that the outside toilet ordinance be rigidly enforced and the police chief be so instructed.

It was then moved by Porter, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the Recorder order " Building Permits" signs printed.

It was also moved by Beck, seconded by Porter and carried, that a charge of \$ 5.00 be made for " Building Permits" issued for newly erected or remodeling structures.

No other business appearing, the Council adjourned.

Special Meeting Wednesday-Dec. 20 -1950

A special council meeting was held on Wednesday, Dec. 20 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor, City Atty. Recorder, Supt. Raines and councilmen Anderson, Beck, Kraft, Porter and Rupp.

Mayor Eversole announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of meeting with representatives of the P.G.E. and Mr. Dunn from the B.P.A. and trying to agree on the substance of a contract prepared by Atty. Zimmerman.

The Recorder then read the contract aloud and after discussion, it was moved by Porter, seconded by Beck and carried, that it be accepted, subject to small changes in Paragraphs 6 and 7, which changes were to be made and the contract then be resubmitted.

Chairman Porter of the Finance Com. then reported having checked over the City Treasurer's report for the quarter ending Sept. 30 and found no criticism.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, that Mrs. June Stein should be allowed .85c per hour for her services, dating from December first.

It then appearing that Carl Schaarschmidt, operating the Canby Taxi Cab was desirous of having something to show that he was privileged to operate, the City Atty. was asked to look up the original franchise or contract.
