

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, Febr. 6-1950

The Council met in regular session on Monday, February 6, 1950 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present on roll call: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Kraft, Porter and Rupp. Councilmen Beck and Irwin reported later.

Reports of Officers

City Treasurer submitted and read his reports covering the last quarter for 1949 and also summary for the whole year.

On motion by Porter, seconded by Kraft and carried, the Treasurer's reports were accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Chief of Police Hudson reported his activities for January.

The Recorder reported 14 cases handled in court during the month, resulting in fines assessed in the sum of \$ 155.00-costs \$ 34.00.

Supt. Raines announced that some damages had been caused by the recent storms--three transformers burned out, some poles down and roads crumbling. He also bro't to the attention of the Council that there had been some difficulty in collecting from the Wilkinson mill, that the present operators were leasing the property and had made no deposit to cover their bills. Suggested that a possible loss might occur, if mill should cease operations.

Raines also stated that additional customers could be secured from those living on property adjoining the city limits and thought the so-called "Gentlemen's Agreement" with the P.G.E. should be forgotten.

It was the opinion of the Council members, however, that nothing should be done along this line, until petitions had been presented, asking for service.

Fire Chief Yoder reported having answered two calls within the City and three in the Rural District-no damage. Also mutual aid call to Needy on Febr. 3.

Councilman Irwin then reported that, in his opinion, a proper addition to the City building, in order to house fire equipment would cost \$ 20000.

After some discussion, Councilman Kraft was asked to contact the Rural District directors as to what rental they would expect to pay.

Whereupon the council considered the ordinance drawn up by the city attorney, fixing a charge to water users for future sewer service.

It appearing, however, that the ordinance as written did not exactly meet the requirements, the City Attorney, ~~was~~ asked to prepare another.

The Mayor then stated that he would like to appoint a committee to meet with the directors of the Rural Fire District in order to arrive at an understanding for mutual operations, the same to be embodied in an ordinance to be presented to the Council for their consideration.

This being agreeable to the Council, he asked Messrs. Kraft, Porter and Yoder to serve as such.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
