

Special Meeting
Monday, ~~March 2~~ -1950

The City Council met in special session on Monday, February 20 and was called to order at 8.20 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Supt Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Irwin, Kraft, Porter and Rupp.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the purchase of a roller to be used in paving and repairing streets.

Messrs. Anderson and Raines reported that they had made a trip to Salem and had inspected a used machine belonging to the West Machinery Co., who had offered it for \$ 800 delivered at Canby.

They also reported having examined another roller, but recommended the first as the best bargain.

Whereupon, on motion of Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to purchase the first mentioned roller and ask for immediate delivery.

Councilman Kraft then stated that he had recently met with the Rural Fire District directors and explained to them the idea of building an addition to the City Hall in order to furnish sufficient space for housing all fire equipment. He stated that some doubted that this would provide sufficient space and suggested the possibility of their supplying funds for a new building to be located on the south side of the city. He also said that the R.F.D directors would meet on the following Wednesday evening and suggested that the Council members be present for a discussion.

The Wait Park matter was then bro't up, it appearing that the Recreation Commission proposed seeding and installing a soft ball diamond. In this connection it would be necessary to consider the intallation of lights, water, rest rooms, etc., involving cooperating with the city. No action and the meeting then adjourned.

Special Meeting
Thursday, March 2-1950

A special meeting was called by the Mayor to meet with the Recreation Commission to discuss matters pertaining to the improvement of Wait Park.

Present: Mayor Eversole, the Recorder and Councilmen Beck, Kraft, Porter and Rupp.

Meeting was called to order at about 8.30 P.M.

Gordon Weygandt spoke first for the Recreation Commission, outlining the tentative plans they had in mind for the improvement of the park, providing they were agreeable to the members of the City Council.

It was apparent that it would first be necessary to prepare the ground for seeding and Mr. Weygandt stated that Mr. Girod had agreed to donate the seed; also that plenty of free labor had been promised towards the installation of a soft ball diamond and back-stop and horse shoe pit.

The cooperation of the Council was asked, especially in the matter of installing water piping and furnishing water.

Whereupon on motion by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to cooperate with the Commission according to the program presented.

In this connection Mayor Eversole stated that he felt it would be proper to appoint a committee from the Council to check on and give their approval or otherwise on the work of the Commission.

Messrs. Rupp, Beck and Kraft were then appointed.
