

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, March 6-1950

The Council met in regular session on Monday, March 6 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, the Recorder, Supt. Raines and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Kraft, Porter and Rupp.

Absent-Irwin.

The minutes of the previous meeting of February 6 and special meetings of Febr. 20 and March 2 were read and approved.

Communications.

From the State Highway Commission relative to Street Fund allocations.

From State Highway Commission stating that they would investigate the advisability of installing traffic signal light at 99E and Ivy street.

From League of Oregon Cities regarding meeting to be held at Milwaukie on March 8.

From C.E. Stewart, District Engineer as to how much time could be allowed before sewer construction must start; it being his understanding that the final advance of funds would be the controlling date. (July 1949).

Petitions.

A petition presented by Messrs. Atchison, Farnsworth and Landon, signed by nearly one hundred residents of rural districts adjacent to Canby was then read by the Recorder. The petition requested that the electric distribution lines of the Canby system be extended to serve them.

Mayor Eversole stated that the matter had been under discussion and assured the petitioners that further attention would be given in the immediate future.

The above claims were, on motion, seconded and carried approved and warrants ordered drawn. On roll call-Yeas 5-nays 0.

Mayor Eversole then announced that, quite recently there had been several near accidents at the Southern Pacific crossing on Elm street-thought something should be done about it.

The Recorder was therefore asked to write Supt. Hopkins suggesting that a signal system be installed, similar to those at the crossings on Ivy and Grant streets, otherwise it would be necessary to request the slowing down of the trains while passing thro' Canby.

Reports of officers.

Chief Yoder of the Fire Department reported one mutual aid call to Aurora during the month. Also stated that a new ladder was needed. He also suggested that new ordinances should be passed, governing department operations.

The Recorder reported 13 cases in his court in February, resulting in fines assessed amounting to \$ 135.00-costs \$ 32.50.

Councilman Kraft then reviewed the recent crime wave in Canby and the necessity of having employed several special police for a period. He added that most of the cases had been cleared up.

Supt. Raines asked for more street lights similar to those already installed on First street, and on motion, seconded and carried, he was authorized to order 15 more, it being understood that one to be placed adjacent to the High School would be paid for by the School District.

The Mayor then stated that it would be in order to appoint at this time the budget committee to serve from July 1-1950 for one year and to meet with the Council at the proper time.

Ordinances.

The following ordinance was then introduced, read for the first time and on motion, seconded and carried, ordered published in two issues of the Canby Herald and to come up for final passage at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, April 3-1950.

Ordinance No. 359.

An ordinance to create a sinking fund for the purpose to acquire, own, construct, equip, operate and maintain a sewage disposal plant or plants, sewers, equipment and appurtenances necessary for a complete sewer system and disposal plant; and imposing a charge of 50 cents per month on all water users of the Canby water system.

Councilman Beck then suggested that the Kiwanis Club take a traffic count at the intersection of Ivy street and 99E, if the Council so approved, which it proceeded to do.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
