

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, April 3, 1950

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, April 3 and was called to order promptly at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen-Anderson, Beck, Kraft, Porter and Rupp. Absent Irwin.

The minutes of the previous meeting of March 6 were read and approved.

Communications.

From L.P. Hopkins, Supt. So. Pacific with reference to our request for signal at Elm street crossing and stating that installation of same would cost \$ 5000 and maintenance \$ 25 per month. He asked what portion of this the City would be willing to assume.

(Not willing to assume any part and Recorder instructed to answer to that effect).

From Oregon Assc. of City Police Officers calling attention to annual Conference to be held in Salem on May 2 and 3.

From special agt. F.B.I. enclosing program of Juvenile Control School April 3-7 in Portland.

From Chas. Dunn, District Mgr-Bonneville Power Adm. announcing appointment of Loyd L. Allen as District Engineer, Lower Columbia District.

From Canby Kiwanis Club expressing appreciation of aid in improving Wait Park.

Reports of Officers.

City Treasurer Eid presented his report for the quarter ending March 31, the same being accepted to audit by the Finance Committee.

The report of the Chief of Police was read by the Recorder and covered his activities during March.

The Recorder reported 33 cases in his court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 317.50-costs \$ 82.50.

Fire Chief Yoder submitted prices on ladder, which was needed by the Department and on motion, seconded and carried, the committee in charge was authorized to purchase same.

Chief Yoder also stated that Silverton had a quantity of fire hydrants on hand, which could be bo't at a reduced price.

Supt. Raines then presented a rough draft of a contract between the Portland General Electric and Bonneville Power Administration and stated that Mr. Chas. Dunn, District Manager for the Lower Columbia District would explain it's contents. Mr. Dunn stated that in that portion of the contract relative to future service for Canby, the P.G.E. Co. agreed to install a 57M volt line from West Linn to Canby to be completed on or before October 1950; also inside of two years to extend same to Salem.

Mr. Dunn desired to know the feeling of the Council members in this matter, as when such contract was accepted, it would mean that the item asking for funds to build a line to serve Canby direct would be stricken from Bonneville's appropriation request.

After discussion, questions and answers by Mr. Dunn, it developed that the members were favorable, providing the P.G.E. Co. was made to live up to the agreement. Mr. Dunn thought there would be no trouble on that score, once they had signed up.

Committee Reports

Councilman ^{Porter} reported that he had contacted directors of the Union High School District regarding assuming the expense of a street light, if placed at or in the vicinity of the building, and was told that the item would be placed on their budget.

Council Beck stated that work on the City Park would soon be started.

Mayor Eversole then said he thought it would be a good idea to have a sewer committee composed of perhaps two from the Council and a like number from outside. Whereupon, on motion by Kraft, seconded by Porter and carried, he was authorized to appoint such a committee.

The Mayor then appointed Messrs. Beck and Anderson from the council and C.E. Johnson, Sr. and Kenneth Reynolds as outside members.

Councilman Kraft reported that he understood that the Rural Fire District directors were negotiating with the American Legion for their property on Grant st. south of the Highway.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that Canby adopt the daylight savings plan as of April 30 and that the following resolution be adopted, a copy of which to be forwarded to Mayor Lee of Portland and to each of the commissioners and to the League of Oregon Cities. Voting on this was as follows: Yeas-Beck, Porter and Rupp. Nays-Anderson, not voting -Kraft.

Portland Blamed for Nuisance of Daylight Time in Resolution

Following is the text of the resolution adopted by the Canby City Council Monday night, putting daylight saving time into effect April 30:

WHEREAS, the city of Portland, Oregon, has adopted so-called daylight saving time effective April 30, 1950, without regard to the wishes or convenience of neighboring cities or of rural residents of Oregon and Southern Washington, and WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Canby, Oregon, regards so-called daylight saving time as a public nuisance and an unnecessary subterfuge, and

WHEREAS, an even greater nuisance to the people of the Canby community would result from any attempt to maintain two standards of time, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Canby, Oregon, hereby reluctantly directs that at 2 a.m., April 30, 1950, the city's clocks shall be moved forward one hour, and that the resultant time shall be the official time of the City of Canby from that hour until 2 a.m., September 24, 1950, when the hands of the city's clocks shall be moved back one hour. And be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution shall be made and sent to the Mayor of the City of Portland, to each Commissioner of the City of Portland, and to the League of Oregon Cities.

Ordinances No. 359

Whereupon Ordinance No. 359, being an ordinance to create a sinking fund for the purpose of acquiring, owning, constructing, equipping, operating and maintaining a sewage disposal plant or plants, sewers, equipment and appurtenances necessary for a complete sewer system and disposal plant and fixing a charge of .50c per month upon all water users of the City of Canby, using water from the Canby Water System-came up for final action, said Ordinance having been introduced and read for the first time at the regular meeting of the City Council held on March 6, 1950 and duly and legally published in two successive issues of the Canby Herald.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above Ordinance was duly passed.
