Reports of Officers

Chief of Police Hudson submitted a report of police activities for the month of June and also one covering the past year ending June 30-1949.

The Recorder reported 42 cases in his Court during June, resulting in fines aggregating \$ 379.50-costs \$ 101.00-net \$ 278.50.

The City Treasurer presented his report for the quarter ending June 30 and on motion, seconded and carried, it was accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Cemetery matters

Caretaker Galbraith asked for a four weeks vacation, with pay, inasmuch as he did not take one last year. Also asked that his July warrant be granted him in advance. On motion by Beck, seconded by Rupp and carried his requests were granted.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Rupp and carried, that the minutes of June 6, 1949 with reference to use of metal or concrete boxes be overruled and that those persons desiring to use wooden burial boxes be allowed to do so, but paying the same price as for the others, the difference in price to be used for necessary extra fillings.

Supt. Raines then reported that the Buchanan-Cellers water main had been laid, as per instructions at meeting of June 6.
