

Regular Meeting
Monday, August 1-1949

The Council met in regular session on Monday, August 1 and was called to order at 8.15.

Present on roll call-Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Irwin, Porter and Rupp. Supt. Raines and Councilman Beck reported later.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of July 5 and the special meetings of July 6 and 29 were read and approved.

Communications

Letter from a Mr. Geo. O. Hamilton commending Mayor Eversole for his letter to the Journal, which concerned Supt. Raines visit to Washington and the cool reception received from Senator Cordon when the sub-station matter was presented.

Also a petition signed by about 130 citizens of Canby and vicinity, asking that the Council close on Sunday, all places where alcoholic beverages are sold.

Reports of officers

Chief of Police Hudson presented his report for July, which was read by the Recorder.

The Recorder reported 38 cases in his court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 362.50, costs \$ 95.00, net \$ 267.50.

Supt. Raines reported having received complaints relative to the operation of the City dump. Also stated that it would be necessary to either purchase or return the demonstration light installed on First St. several months ago.

It was therefore moved by Porter seconded by Irwin and carried that the light be purchased.

Raines also reported having completed the oiling of Amrine Road and Wait Avenue, and gravel laid at S.E. crossing of Grant St.

It then appearing that there had been some criticism regarding the preparation of the 1949-50 budget, it was moved by Porter, seconded by Kupp and carried, that a special meeting be called by the Mayor for the purpose of discussing the matter.

Mayor Eversole then stated that at this time and with the approval of the Council, he would appoint Mr. Porter as Chairman of the Finance Committee and the Light Dept. By motion, seconded and carried the members approved the appointment.

It then being necessary to elect a President of the Council, Mr. Kraft was nominated and there being no other nominations, it was moved seconded and carried that nominations be closed and the Recorder cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Kraft.

The Mayor then stated that Neal Thompson, although a short distance outside the city limits desired to have electric service served to him by our electric power department. This matter was left in the hands of Messrs. Porter and Raines to contact the P.G.E.

Supt. Raines was also asked to contact Mr. Wilkinson in regard to various complaints received from residents adjoining his mill pond, and who were bothered by mosquitoes apparently breeding there.

Mr. Chas. Luelling entered a complaint concerning brush and rubbish on property adjacent to him, as being a nuisance. He was told that if he would submit the name and address of the owner, the Recorder would send a notification to clean up.

Mayor Eversole then bro't up the matter of advertising signs displayed on city property at or near the Highway and Ivy sts. It was the decision of the Council that these signs should be removed and the Recorder was asked to write the persons responsible for their installation.

Clayton Yoder then reported that the new ambulance had been out on seven calls during the month and proving very satisfactory. He stated, however, that no permanent arrangement for housing had yet been made.

No further business appearing, the meeting then adjourned.
