## Reports of Officers

Supt. Raines reported several new street lights having been installed in the Airport tract and on Locust street.

The Recorder reported 23 cases in his court during the month, with resulting fines amounting to \$ 264.50-costs \$ 65.00-net \$ 199.50 Fire Chief Yoder reported fire calls in September as follows:

Two in the City-no damage. Eight rural district calls with damage estimated about \$ 3300. Also five calls for ambulance service.

Yoder also stated that a count showed 82 hydrants and standpipes in the city and presented a list of eight which needed attention.

It was then moved by Beck , seconded by Anderson and carried, that the above mentioned liability policy as outlined by Mr. Telford, carrying a premium of \$ 590.96 be accepted.

Whereupon it was moved by Beck, seconded by Irwin and carried, that the Bonneville Power Administration be petitioned to allow the City to install 10 Mercury vapor lights for First street and elsewhere, the cost of which to be charged against the Light Fund.

Atty. Zimmerman then bro't up the matter of rent control elimination and explained the procedure necessary to bring it about.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
