Reports of Officers

Fire Chief Yoder reported one call to fire at Frank Carroll with no damage -no rural calls.

Also reported four calls for the

ambulance.

The Recorder reported 29 cases in Court with fines aggregating \$ 302.50 Costs \$ 74.50.

Supt. Raines stated that installment of water and light equipment for the Brown tract had been nearly completed. Councilman Anderson stated that the street in front of the High School

needed considerable gravel; also streets adjacent to various churches. It was the opinion of the council that in the case of the school, a por-

tion of the expense should be borne

by the district and the Recorder was instructed to write the Board that the City would assume half the expense. Councilman Beck then bro't up the matter of Mrs. Decker's salary, stating that she had asked for an increase. Whereupon on motion by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to pay her \$ 225.00 per month from November first. It was also understood that her part time assistant should receive 85c per hour.

The matter of imposing sewer service charges to be added to water users bills then came up for discussion. In this connection it was suggested that a point of law was involved, in that it might be illegal to impose any such charge by ordinance, without a vote of the people.

The Recorder was therefore asked to write the League of Oregon Cities

for an opinion or court decision relative to this point.

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the application of Mrs. Crosson for a renewal to operate her business be recommended by the Council.

Supt. Raines then spoke of the poor lighting in the city offices and thought something should be done about improving it. No action was taken other than to leave the matter in the hands of the proper committee.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
