Regular Monthly Meeting Monday, Jan. 3-1949

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, January 3 and was

called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, Treasurer John Eid, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Eversole, Irwin, Kraft and Rupp.

All councilmen and recently elected officers were then sworn into

office by the City Recorder.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of December 6 and those of the special meeting of December 8 were read and approved.

Communications.

Atty. Zimmerman presented a letter from Lewis and Eisenhauer, attorneys at Law, asking the Council to pass a resolution notifying the County Court that the City of Canby has no objections to vacation of that por-

tion of County Road No. 395, lying within the city limits.

After discussing the above, the Council came to the following conclusion: There is no objection by the City of Canby to the vacation of that that portion of County Road No. 395 lying within the city limits, providing there be no attempt to vacate any portion of the deeded right of way conveyed to the City by the Southern Pacific Co. for street purposes.

Also communication from the City Attorney relative to the publication of a code of Ordinances, as provided in Section 95-501 Oregon Compiled

Laws Annotated.

Also letter from the Volunteer Fire pepartment announcing that at a recent meeting, Chris Kraft, Jr. had been elected as Fire Chief for the

coming year.

Mayor Markee then submitted a message to the Council, in which he outlined the growth and development of the City, the past few years and the many new problems as aresult. He made various suggestions and recommendations as to properly care for this expansion so as to best serve the needs of the City and urged that each councilman be agressive and diligent in his efforts to make Canby a good residential city and equip it with facilities to properly care for its continued growth.

He then submitted the following assignments and appointments for the

It was moved, seconded and carried that the above

appointments be approved.

The members of the Council then proceeded to ballot on the office of President of the Council, which resulted in the election of Rex Eversole for that position, and the Mayor so declared.

Reports

Chief of Police Hudson submitted his report of activities for December and also for the six months period ending Dec. 31-1948 The City Recorder reported 22 cases in his court in December, resulting in fines of \$226.50 -costs \$55.00-net \$171.50 Also for the year 1948-370 cases with fines aggregating \$ 3630.00 costs # 918.50 leaving a net of # 2712.00.

Fire Chief Yoder submitted a report covering the year (1948) showing 9 alarms answered, within the city, with actual fire loss of # 300.00; also nine inspections made and hazards removed.

He also reported that 13 alarms had been answered for the rural

fire district, with losses estimated at # 11825.00.

Supt. Raines stated that he would have a report covering the year ready for the February meeting. Also that house numbering had been completed and some drainage work was being done.

The City Treasurer then read his reports for the quarter ending December 31 and his regular annual report for 1948.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the Treasurer's reports be accepted subject to audit by the finance committee.

The following bills and claims against the city were then presented and on motion, seconded and carried ordered paid and warrants drawn: On roll call, Yeas 6-nays O.
