

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, April 4, 1949

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 4 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Eversole, Irwin, Kraft and Rupp.

Mayor Markee announced that inasmuch as there was a large delegation of members of the Pioneer Cemetery Association present, the regular order of business would be suspended and attention given to them.

Whereupon Mr. Clarence May, President of the Association introduced each visitor and called on Mr. A.F. Knight for remarks.

Mr. Knight outlined the past history of the cemetery and the recent formation of the legally organized association. He then presented a resolution drawn up by their committee, mentioning the neglect and poor condition of the grounds, the same being a disgrace to the City of Canby and urging that the City take over and care for them in the future. A petition was also presented, signed by many citizens, asking that the City of Canby take over, clean up and build a suitable fence around the grounds.

Mr. Knight then called on Mr. Walter Meacham, Secretary of the Oregon Trails Association, who endorsed Mr. Knight's remarks and who stated that, as a matter of pride, as well as good advertising, he thought it would be good business for the City to assume the care and upkeep of this historical land mark.

Mayor Markee then responded, stating that he was glad to see such an organized movement and that the City Council was the organ of the people and trying it's best to meet their wishes. He explained, however, the financial situation relative to the matter, but that careful consideration would be given and such action as seemed suitable would be taken in the near future.

Mr. Eversole then asked if any estimate had been made as to the cost of placing the grounds in good condition, the answer being that it was thought the sum of \$ 533.80 would be sufficient.

The minutes of the previous meeting of March 7, the adjourned of March 21 and the special meeting of March 24 were then read and on motion, seconded and carried declared approved.

Communications.

From Oregon Association of city police officers enclosing schedule of training school programs to be held in various cities.

Under this heading, the Recorder read Mayor Markee's letter to the members of Congress relative to the installation of a substation and direct service from Bonnevile.

The Council then listened to an oral communication, voiced by Harold Henry, Tom Fletcher and Gordon Weygandt and speaking in behalf of the Recreation Commission. They asked for financial help from the City to pay for the services of a supervisor to care for the grounds, lights and equipment and to generally oversee the activities of the youngsters during the summer months.

Whereupon it was moved by Eversole, seconded by Irwin and carried, that the sum of \$ 100.00 for June, July and August be allowed for (each mo) this purpose, instead of the \$ 15.00 per month as at present.

Ordinances

Ordinance No. 355 and Ordinance No. 356 to reduce the rate of interest allowed on deposits of water and light users and Ordinance No. 357 defining residential and commercial use of water-all introduced, read, passed on first reading and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on May 2-1949. Ordered posted.
