

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
May 2-1949

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, May 2 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Recorder Evans and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Eversole, Irwin, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of April 4 and those of the adjourned meetings of April 18 and 26 were read and approved.

The Recorder then read a communication from Wm. C. Palmer, Atty. and Chairman of the Necrology Committee of the Multnomah Bar Association. Mr. Palmer stated that he had recently learned from Mr. Walter Meacham that the matter of the preservation of the Pioneer Cemetery in Canby was being considered and that his committee was very much interested, especially in the fact that the cemetery contained the remains of Judge Aaron E. Wait, first Chief Justice of the State of Oregon.

He furthermore stated that, in the event our City should decide to take over and operate the cemetery, machinery would be set up to erect a monument in memory of Judge Wait.

Whereupon Clarence May speaking in behalf of the Pioneer Cemetery Society stated that considerable work had been done towards clearing up the grounds and that a call for workers had been sent out for May 21 in order to get the Cemetery in as good condition as possible for Memorial Day.

Mr. May also stated that the Society was short of funds and suggested that the City might be willing to help, possibly by erecting a substantial fence around the grounds, the distance being about 840 feet.

Mr. Geo. Randall also spoke, seconding Mr. May's remarks and stated that the Oregon Trail Association contemplated placing various markers over some of the graves.

Whereupon Mr. Geo. Berg, Chairman of School District # 86, being present asked for the privilege of installing the sidewalk at the grade school about four feet inside the present grade and using the parkway for parking cars head on; thus providing space for many more cars than could otherwise be accommodated. He also asked that water hydrant and electric light pole be moved, the expense to be borne by the school district.

It was then moved by Eversole, seconded by Beck and carried, that this matter be left to the chairman of the street commission to work out with the school board.

Canby Sub-station matter.

The Mayor then announced that Mr. Hittle of the Bonneville Power Administration and Mr. Gus Norwood, Secretary of the Northwest Public Power Association were present at his request to advise as to the best method of presenting this matter to the Senate Appropriations Committee to induce them to include an item providing funds for a Canby Sub-Station as part of the Bonneville Power Administration.

Both men spoke on the subject and recommended a resolution and letters to the senators and Congressman Norblad. Also suggested that a personal representation from Canby might help.

It was then moved by Eversole, seconded by Beck that Supt. Raines appear in Washington before the Committee and state the case. Carried.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Eversole and carried that a resolution or statement be drawn up and various copies made for distribution among the members of the Senate Committee.

Attorney Zimmerman with the help of Messrs. Hittle, Norwood and Raines then retired and later submitted the following:

Canby Sub-Station

The City Council of Canby, Oregon petitions the Senate Appropriations Sub-Committee of the Dep't. of the Interior to recommend funds for the construction of the Canby sub-station as part of the system of the Bonneville Power Administration.

For that purpose, by resolution duly introduced and adopted at the regular Council meeting held on May 2, 1949, it was unanimously voted to send the Superintendent of Public Works, Mr. Carl Raines, as representative of the City of Canby.

Reports

A report of the City Treasurer was submitted covering the first quarter ending March 30, the same being accepted subject to O.K. by Finance Committee.

The Recorder reported 16 cases held in his Court during April, resulting in fines assessed of \$ 152.50 with costs of \$ 40.00-net \$ 112.50.

Councilman^W reported having received several applications for the night policing job, but as yet no selection.

Councilman Rupp for the Cemetery Com. reported having considered the matter of increasing price of lots and other services, but no decision or recommendation to present at this time.

Supt. Raines presented an estimate on proposed road work.

Mayor Markee then stated that he would, if agreeable to the Council, set the date of May 16 for a meeting of the Budget Committee.

Councilman Kraft then bro't to the attention of the Council that the annual convention or school of instruction for firemen would be held at Coos Bay, May 12-13-14 and that several members of the Canby department were planning to attend.

It was therefore moved by Eversole and seconded by Irwin and carried, that the sum of \$ 150.00 be allowed them towards

their expenses.

The Recorder then presented the application of Frank Rice (Rose Cafe) to the State of Oregon for permission to sell beer, it being necessary to meet with the approval of the Council.

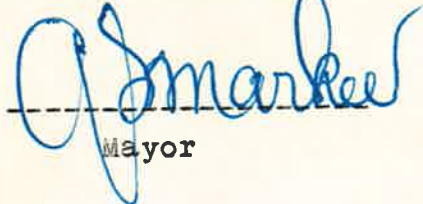
Whereupon, on motion, seconded and carried it was voted to approve the same and the Recorder was instructed to sign the application, showing the approval of the Council.
