## Remilar Monthly Meeting Mc ay, June 6, 1949

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, June 6, 1949 and was called to order at 8.20 P.M.

Mayor Markee, Atty Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and

Councilmen Beck, Anderson, Eversole, Irwin, Kraft and Rupp.
The minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 2 and those of the special meeting of May 16 were read and approved.

#### Communications.

A letter from Senator Morse relative to the Canby sub-station matter and stating that Supt. Raines made an excellent statement in behalf of the appropriation.

Letter from the Oregon State Sanitary Authority to Messrs. Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield stating that the plans, specifications, and contract documents in connection with the proposed sewer system and treatment plant had met with their approval and a set forwarded to the Federal Works Agency.

Letter from the Mayor of Springfield to Mayor Markee asking for results of municipal ownership in Canby and the Mayor's answer to the same.

Under this order of business, Supt. Raines made an excellent oral report of his trip to Washington and his presentation of facts and figures to the Senate Appropriations sub-committee in behalf of the sub-station.

Councilman Beck also reported on a very interesting meeting of the League of Oregon Cities, recently held at West Linn.

# Reports of Officers

Report of the Chief of Police showing activities for the preceding month was read by the Recorder.

The Recorder reported 30 cases before his court in May, re sulting in fines aggregating # 300.00-Costs \$ 75.00.

Supt. Raines reported on future road work mapped out-on Amrine Road, east end of Wait Avenue and grading and gravel on various other streets. He stated that Parmenter had a mixture of gravel and sand for a first base for .90c per yard, which he expected to use.

He also stated that the Oregon Turkey Growers wanted a water pipe

from Ivy St. to their property and would stand the expense.

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried, that 6 inch pipe be laid and hydrants be installed for the Oregon Turkey Growers and Buchanan-Cellers, the City to lay the pipe and furnish the two hydrants, the above firms to pay for pipe and conn ections and expense of opening and closing ditch.

The matter of better street lighting was then discussed and

Councilman Eversole suggested that the Council members attend a demonstration of various lights to be put on by the P.G.E. in

Portland on June 20.

Councilman Rupp reporting on Cemetery matters, then recommended the following rates to be charged in the future:

It was then moved by Eversole, seconded by Beck and carried, that the above rates be adopted and to go into effect at once.

It was also moved by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, that in the future, metal or concrete boxes be used instead of wooden boxes.

In connection with the operation of the Cemetery, it was found that many of the old rules could not be applied and that a revision was necessary, although no particular action was taken at this time.

### RESOLUTION

The following resolution, which had been previously signed by all members of the Council was then introduced and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted and ordered spread on the minutes.

WHEREAS, The Canby Volunteer Fire Department, by their own
donation and by popular subscriptions of others, have
raised a sufficient sum of money to purchase an ambulance,
to be registered in the name of the City of Canby, and
WHEREAS, The said ambulance is now ready for delivery at Lima, Ohiom
and to be driven from there to Canby in the near future, and
WHEREAS, The Volunteer Fire Dep't is prepared to make payment for the
said ambulance from the funds collected, but is of the opinion
that a check should be drawn to the City of Canby and a warrant
issued by the City Recorder, therefore showing actual payment
by the City, now therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED\* THAT the said funds be accepted from the Volunteer Fire

Dep't and the Recorder instructed to issue a warrant to E.L.

Purdy and Sons, through whom the said ambulance is being purchased, and further-

BE IT RESOLVED, That the City of Canby does hereby accept ownership of this ambulance, to be operated and cared for under the jurisdiction of the said Canby Volunteer Fire Department.
