#### Reports of Officers

Supt. Raines reported having finished Laying water pipe on Wait Ave.

and Amrine Road, also replacing old pipe on Third Avenue.
Also stated that in his opinion, the Council should have in mind future water supply, as on account of growing population, a greater supply would be needed by another year. Suggested that a water engineer should be employed to look over the situation and advise. Left to the Supt. and Water Committee .

Whereupon, on recommendation of the finance committee, it was moved, seconded and carried, that the salary of the City Treasurer be \$ 25.00 per month and that of Mrs. Decker, bookkeeper be \$ 200.00 per month, both dating from July 1-1948.

# August 2-continued.

Councilman Johns A, Chairman of the Finance committee reported that arrangements had been made for Mr. Wilson from the office of Ptepenbrook and Kron, Public Accountants to make the annual audit of the City records

Mayor Markee then announced that an ordinance should be prepared, relative to deposits required from new customers, the rate of interest to be allowed on same and possibly the return of deposit after a certain period and when the customer's credit rating has been well established.

This matter was left to the Committee to work out with the aid of the

City Attorney.

Councilman Eversole then stated that the nightwatchman should now be fitted out for a uniform, which matter met with the approval of the Council, with instructions to order same.

Chairman Makin of Streets and P.P. that 2nd. Street should be improved from Ivy to Fir, but that first the proper curbing should be installed. It was left to the Committee to check with all property

owners to get their cooperation, if possible.

Mr. Makin also stated that the Clausen addition streets had been graded and should be accepted by the City subject to O.K. by the City Engineer.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.

Special Meeting August 11-1948

A special meeting of the Council was held on Wednesday, August 11-1948 and called to order at about 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Monahan and Perkett. Supt. Raines and the Recorder.

Both the Mayor and President of the Council being absent, Mr.

Perkett acted as chairman.

It was announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the installation of water and electric service at the rquest of Geo. Irwin, on N. 6th. Ave. leading to Viginia;

also any other business that might properly be conducted.

It was then moved by Makin, seconded by Monahan and carried, that the above mentioned improvements be installed by the water and Light pepartment, with the understanding that the owner of the adjacent lots grade and gravel the street according to requirements.

Whereupon Councilman Monahan asked the Council members for an opinion as to the division of the City for the purpose of house numbering. It was the unanimous opinion that the division should be Ivy Street running North and South and Railroad Avenue running East and West.
