

Special Meeting
Monday, Octo. 25-1948

The City Council met in special session on Monday, October 25, 1948 and was called to order at 8.20 o'clock, P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and councilmen, Cutsforth, Johnson, Eversole, Krueger, Makin and Monahan.

Absent-Kraft.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called primarily for the purpose of considering what action the City should take and what City funds, if any, should be furnished in supplying facilities for installation of water mains, hydrants and electric power lines for the new sub-division being promoted by Mr. & Mrs. Lester Brown in the eastern part of Canby.

After a lengthy discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, that the cost of installing the electric power lines and poles should be assumed by the City and the expense of water mains and hydrants for water service for the addition be borne by the owners, Mr. and Mrs. Brown.

Whereupon Chairman Eversole of the Police Committee reported that Chief of Police Hudson had, for several days been safeguarding the school children while crossing the Pacific Highway, but it appearing that so few children were involved and so much of Mr. Hudson's time from his other duties being consumed, it was thought best to discontinue the practice and recommend to the school board that some other arrangements be made.

The Mayor then announced that the Recreation Commission had appealed to the City for assistance in carrying on, that for sometime it's affairs had been managed by a few individuals, who had contributed generously of their time and efforts, but that now it would be necessary to hire some help, which with various activities in sight, called for some financing.

Whereupon it was moved by Makin, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that the sum of \$ 50.00 from the recreation fund of the City be allowed for this purpose towards their expenses for the period ending Dec. 31-1948, and a warrant was ordered drawn for same.

Mayor Markee then stated that the Recorder's office needed a better filing system and that additional filing cabinets should be purchased as soon as possible.

At the request of Police Chief Hudson, the Recorder then presented a list of names suggested and from which he desired the Council members to recommend four to form a police reserve, as in accordance with the action taken at the meeting of October 4.

No more business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
