

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, January 5-1948

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, January 5, 1948 and called to order at 8.30 P.M. by President of the Council Cutsforth in the absence of Mayor Markee .

Present and answering roll call -Attorney Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Cutsforth, Eversole, Johnson, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Monahan and Perkett.

The minutes of the previous meeting of December first were read and Approved.

Communications.

Letter from Alfred Kraft, Secretary of the Canby Volunteer Fire Department, stating that at a meeting on Dec. 16-1947, Clayton Yoder had been re-elected Fire Chief, subject to the approval of the Council.

(This action met with approval of the Council)

Two letters from satisfied customers, commehding Chief of Police Hudson for his courteous treatment in handling theer cases.

Communication from the Chief of Police , Oregon City, asking that Canby be represented at a meeting to be held On Jan. 7 relative to radio matters. (Kraft and Yoder asked to attend)

Letters from Ken Blais, Eugene and R.H.Laws , Lebanon, relative to Airstrip matter.

A petition was then presented, signed by the Board of Directors of School District # 86, asking for the vacation of Fifth Street between Grant and Fir streets and the alley between Fourth and Fifth Streets, running from Grant to Fir; attached to petition were the consent of more than two-thirds of the legal owners of the property adjoining or affected by proposed vacation.

Whereupon the following Resolution was introduced by Makin and on motion of Johnson, seconded by Monahan and carried declared adopted:

" WHEREAS, On account of the growth of the population of Canby and the increase in the enrollment of pupils in the Grade School, to such an extent that facilities are overtaxed and that the space for which said school house was first constructed is now very limited and creating a situation of great inconvenience and disadvantage-

THEREFORE NOW BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with Section 95-1331 to and including Section 95-1340, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, " Notice of Street Vacation" be published, as to the above named street and alley, in five consecutive weekly publications of the Canby Herald, the first publication to be January 8, 1948, the last to be Febr. 5, 1948 ; also, that within five days from the first publication, the City Recorder shall post, or cause to be posted a " Notice of Street Vacation" at or near each end of proposed vacation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the hour of eight o'clock in the evening of February 9, 1948, in the Council Chamber, in the City Hall, Canby, Oregon be fixed as the time and place for a formal hearing on said vacation proceedings, at which time and place any objections or remonstrances must be filed with the City Recorder in writing prior to the time of said hearing.

Whereupon it appearing that it would be advisable and necessary that the City and the newly formed Rural Fire Protection District enter into a contract or agreement, relative to services and aid by the Fire Dept. of Canby, in case of need, but such contract or agreement not having been prepared as yet, on motion of Eversole, seconded by Monahan and carried, the Chief of the Canby Volunteer Fire Department was instructed to answer calls within the District, until such a time as a contract is accepted or rejected by the City Council.

The Council then listened to Mr. A.N.Ward, who asked for possible relief for standing water adjacent to his property at 4th & Grant sts. This matter was left to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Reports of Officers

City Treasurer Mangus submitted his reports for the quarter ending December 31 and yearly report covering the year 1947.

On motion, seconded and carried the reports were accepted subject to audit by the finance committee.

The report of Chief of Police Hudson, covering his activities in December was read by the Recorder.

Chief Yoder of the Fire Dept. reported call to the Bethke place in December-loss about \$ 300.00. Also stated~~xx~~ that the Department had responded to 33 alarms in 1947- Losses \$ 1,165.00 VAL. \$ 46,650.00 (ESTIMATED)

Supt. Raines reported having received more water pipe and that work was being done on Front Street in changing electric lines to give better service.

Committee Reports

Mr. Makin of Streets and Public Property had no particular report, but stated that any complaints would be investigated and relief furnished as quickly as possible by his department. He also recommended passage of an Ordinance establishing sidewalk grades.

Whereupon on motion of Makin, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to accept the above recommendations of the committee fixing the salaries as stated.
