

The City Council met in session adjourned from Monday, Febr. 2 and was called to order by Mayor Markee at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Cutsforth, Eversole, Johnson, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Monahan and Perrett.

The minutes of Febr. 9 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced that the meeting was being held primarily to listen to any objections or remonstrances in the matter of the proposed closing of certain streets and alley, notices of which had previously been posted in accordance with laws made and provided

The Recorder then read the "NOTICE OF STREET VACATION" and stated that there had been no objections or remonstrances filed; said notice being a part of these minutes.

NOTICE OF STREET VACATION
Notice is hereby given that on the 5th day of January, 1948, based upon the written request and petition of the Board of Directors of CANBY SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 86, of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, filed January 5, 1948, a resolution was duly passed and adopted by the City Council of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, that proceedings should be taken by said City Council of Canby, Oregon, and consummated under Section 95-1331 to and including Section 95-1340, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, for the vacation of FIFTH Street between Grant and Fir Streets and the ALLEY running between Fourth and Fifth Streets, running from Grant to Fir streets, within the corporate limits of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, according to the official plat and survey on file, for the purpose of enlarging the Grade School Building to accommodate all the

pupils now enrolled and to be enrolled in the future, situated adjacent to said Fifth Street and said Alley.

The City Council of Canby, Oregon, has fixed the hour of EIGHT o'clock in the evening of February 9, 1948, in the City Council Chambers, in the City Hall of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, as the time and place for a formal hearing on said vacation proceedings, at which time and place any objections or remonstrances will be heard and considered by the City Council of Canby, Oregon. Objections and remonstrances must be filed with the City Recorder of Canby, Oregon, in writing prior to the time of said hearing.

Whereupon the bill of V.J. Gahler -# 611.64 for ditching 5097 feet-4' ditch was presented and on motion, seconded and carried, was ordered paid and warrant drawn.



It was suggested that Mr. Tom Davis of the Public Roads Administration be contacted, and the Recorder was instructed to write him, asking for a copy of lease, which it would be necessary to enter into, in case the City should decide to proceed in the matter.

It was then moved by Makin, seconded by Eversole and carried, that the contract with Mr. Hinrichs for painting the water tank and which was approved at the last meeting, be changed to the effect, that material will be furnished by contractor, actual cost of which will be borne by the City.

No other business appearing, the meeting then adjourned.
