Regular Monthly Meeting City Council March 1 - 1948

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, March 1-1948 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen: Cutsforth, Eversole, Johnson, Kraft, Krueger, Makin and Perkett. Absent Monahan. The minutes of thepwevious meetings of pebr. 2 and 9th. were then

read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended and the mayor

announced that any visitors would be heard at this time.

Russell Rutherford then presented for consideration, a contract signed by the Directors of the Canby Rural Fire Protection District, relative to proposed service to be furnished by the Canby Volunteer Fire mept., if and when approved by the Council.

It appearing however, that the Fire Dept. members had fixed a different remuneration for their services, other than that set out in the contract, it was decided to refer the matter back to the Fire

and Water committee.

Communications.

Under this head was presented a form letter sent out by the American Public Power Association, an organization apparently formed in the int-

erests of municipal ownership power plants and inviting membership.
In this connection, the Recorder was asked to write the League of Oregon Cities and the Bonneville Power Administration in order to get

their slant on the proposition.

A letter from Mr. Ken Blais relative to the Air-strip was also read, in which he stated that he was still very much interested in leasing

same, if the City should decide to continue negotiations.

The Recorder then read a letter from Mr. W.M. Eartlett, Director of the Oregon State Board of Aeronautics expressing his appreciation for fine service rendered him recently by Chief of Police Hudson.

Reports of Officers

Fire Chief Yoder reported only one call during February-to the Pulley dwelling. Also reported having condemned, as far as living quarters were concerned, property on First Street, the lower floor being occupied by the Canby Electric Co. and owned by the Craig Dedman estate. Chief Yoder furthermore stated that some house cleaning was needed in the department-some of the members failing to attend meetings and drills and others apparently no longer interested.

He asked for the backing of the Council in stirring up and possibly

replacing delinquents.

Caretaker Galbraith wanted to know what the charges should be for seeding lots and straighting markers in the old part of the Cemetery. Left to committee.

Supt. Raines thought the rate of interest on customer's deposits should be reduced; also stated that he would recommend that employees, so desiring it, should be paid semi-monthly. Left to Finance Com.

The Recorder then read the report of the Chief of Police, covering

his activities during the month.

Fines of # 317.00 including court costs of # 72.50 were reported

by the Recorder as having been assessed during February.
Mayor Markee then stated that it was in order at this time to appoint a Budget Committee, who would submit a proposed budget for the fiscal year from July 1 -1948 to June 30-1949. The Committee was named as follows:

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the Recorder be instructed to write the management of the Oregon Corn Show, inviting them to hold the 1948 show in Canby.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to authorize the Health and Police Committee to have an ordinance drawn, amending Ordinance # 299 to include various traffic regulations according to plan presented.

It was also the opinion of the Council members and so ordered, that no signs directing traffic or advertising signs be allowed at the R.R. crossings on Ivy, Grant and Elm streets.

Whereupon the matter of leasing the Aurora air strip was again bro't up and it was decided, that owing to its distance from Canby and the financial obligations involved, it would be best to drop all negotiations and the Recorder was instructed to so notify Mr. Ken Blais of Eugene to that effect.

The idea of installing insulation for the City Hall and weatherstripping for the doors opening into the part housing the fire equipment was then discussed and was referred to the Committee on Streets and P.P. for their consideration.

Ordinance # 348 ordering the closing of certain streets and alley was then read and on motion, seconded and carried, placed on its final passage. Yeas 7 nays 0.

On motion, seconded and carried, the meeting was then adjourned until Monday, March 8-1948 to meet at the usual time.
