

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, April 5-1948

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 5 and was called to order promptly at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: and answering roll call-Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Eversole, Johnson, Kraft, Krueger, Makin and Perkett. Supt. Raines and Councilman Monahan reported later. Councilman Cutsforth absent account illness.

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Reports of Officers

Chief of Police Hudson submitted his report for the month, showing in detail his activities in connection with traffic violations, assisting state police and various other demands for his services.

The Recorder reported 29 cases handled in his court during the month, all for traffic violations, resulting in fines assessed of \$ 290.00-costs \$ 70.00.

Fire Chief Yoder reported one call in the month-the Hans Spahr place, with loss estimated at \$ 1500 for dwelling and \$1500 RHF.

Supt. Raines reported having graded various streets-also that he had been supplied with nearly all needed transformers.

He also stated that he personally owned 73 poles, which he would be willing to turn over to the City at .22c per foot, the cost price.

In this connection, it was moved by Makin, seconded by Johnson, and carried, that this offer be accepted. It was also moved, seconded and carried that Supt. Raines be allowed gas and oil for his personal car, when used on city business.

City Treasurer Mangus then presented and read his reports covering the various funds for the quarter ending March 31-1948, the same being accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Paul Perkett for the Water & Fire Committee reported having given some attention to the matter of entering into a contract with the Rural Fire District, but nothing definite. He suggested, possibly, a five year contract, the City to furnish housing, equipment and service and to be paid by the District from a four mill tax on their valuation. Consideration to be arrived at later.

Chairman Makin of Streets and P.P. reported having received some bids for insulating the City Hall, but suggested that nothing be done at present. He also suggested various street improvements, such as oiling and widening and to be done, from time to time according to funds on hand. It was agreeable to the members to leave the matter in the hands of the Committee. It was also decided to refer the proposed sidewalk curb ordinance back to the committee and city engineer.

Mayor Markee then announced that he would designate the dates between April 12-17 as Clean-Up-Week.
