

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, June 7-1948

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, June 7 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present and answering roll call were-Mayor Markee, City Attorney Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Eversole Johnson, Kraft, Makin, Monahan and Perkett. Councilman Cutsforth and Supt. Raines reported later. Councilman Krueger absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting of May 3 were read and approved.

Communications.

Letters were read from the League of Oregon Cities relative to sub-division control and parks and recreation.

Communication from the District Attorney with reference to operation of gambling devices.

Letter from W.W. Balderree complimenting Chief of Police Hudson on his fine work in handling traffic violations.

Also letter from A.F.Knight to Roscoe Mack relative to the deplorable condition of the old Pioneer Cemetery and suggesting that the City do something about it.

The regular order of business was then suspended and Mr. G.C.Decker being present entered a complaint regarding the destruction of the curb in front of the Clausen property, stating that the owners should be required to replace the same.

In connection with this, the Recorder was instructed to write to the owners, ordering the replacement of the curb, on or before July 15, to the proper grades and levels, as established by the City Engineer.

BE IT RESOLVED: That it is the sense of this Council that this movement go into effect in Canby and we hereby urge all citizens to advance their clocks and other time pieces, one hour, for a period of time ending at 2 o'clock A.M., Sept. 26, 1948.

Reports of Officers

Chief of Police Hudson submitted a report in detail covering his work during the month.

The Recorder reported 20 cases in his court during May, resulting in fines aggregating \$ 205 which included costs of \$ 50.

Chief Yoder of the Fire Department reported on the convention recently held at Baker, three members from Canby having attended.

He stated that there was a good attendance and felt that the boys got considerable good out of it.

No fires were reported for May. He suggested that a standpipe was needed for the protection of the warehouses on the North side of the Southern Pacific tracks.

Supt. Raines reported that most of the transformers on hand had been installed, that he had not yet been able to borrow a "water leak finder" from Oregon City, but that it would be available later.

He also suggested that that the City needed a pole setting rig with attachments. He furthermore recommended that a two way radio be installed in the police car, so that the P.G.E. could be contacted more readily, in case of failure of power. He stated, that at such a time, the telephone lines were badly congested and it was impossible to get through without considerable delay.

Reports of Committees.

Chairman Makin of Streets and P. P. stated that roads must be oiled as soon as graded and grass cut.

Chairman Eversole of Health and Police reported having received several applications for the position of nightwatchman and recommended the appointment of Byron Herreid on a trial basis.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the recommendation of the committee be approved and that Mr. Herreid be placed under bond in the sum of \$ 1000.

Whereupon the matter of the upkeep of the old Pioneer Cemetery was then bro't up and discussed, referring back to the letter of Mr. A.F. Knight previously read; it seemed to be the consensus of opinion that while it deplored the present condition of the grounds, the City had no title and would be at a loss as how to go about to get one, and would not be justified in spending the public funds for this purpose. The Recorder, was however asked to acknowledge Mr. Knight's letter, stating the position and opinion of the Council members.

ORDINANCES.

The following ordinances then came up for final action and on motion, seconded and carried placed on the final passage. Yeas 7-nays 0

Ordinance No. 349, governing charges for temporary electric service and amending Rule 4 of Ord. No. 314.

Ordinance No. 350 amending Ord. No. 304 relating to fixing the compensation and bonds of the Treasurer and City Recorder.

Ordinance No. 351 amending Ord. No. 315 governing curbs and sidewalks in relation to property lines.

Ordinance No. 352 levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within the corporate limits of Canby was then introduced, read for the first time, ordered published and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on Tuesday, July 6, 1948.

It was then moved by Johnson, seconded by Eversole and carried, that any moneys left in Budget accounts at the close of the fiscal year, June 30, 1948 be transferred to the General Fund.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
