## Reports of officers

The Recorder submitted his report for June showing 28 cases handled in court with gross fines of \$ 260 assessed-costs \$ 70.00.

Also was submitted report covering a 11 mos. period ending July 1st. Cases in court 444 with total fines of \$ 4408.00-costs \$ 1091.50.

Chief of Police Hudson's report for June and also for the past 11 months was also read and received with much approval, as being very comprehensive and thorough.

Fire Chief Yoder reported only one call for June-a grass fire.

He stated that it would soon be necessary to purchase 500 or 600 feet of 2½ inch hose and that the old truck should be painted.

Also reported that property owners of vacant lots were being asked to clean up. Yoder also stated that changes in the personnel of the membership were in order, inasmuch as quite a few were never available and some consistently failed to attend drills.

It was then moved by Monahan and seconded by Cutsforth that the Fire and Water Committee select a member to attend the school to be held at Corvallis-July 26-31. Carried.

City Treasurer Mangus then submitted and read his reports for the quarter ending June 30, the same being accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Supt. Raines reported the installation of larger water pipe on Wait Avenue, the old pipe to be layed on the Amrine Road. Considerable delay account solid rock necessitating blasting. Thought some adjustment should be made in the matter of deposits required for both water and light accounts. Suggested that double the amount of the average bill might be a fair amount. Also believed that the interest rate of 5% now allowed should be reduced and that in some cases, where customers had been long time residents, deposit should be refunded.

Also stated that a winch for the truck was needed and it was then moved by Makin, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that the winch be ordered and installed.

It was then moved by Perkett, seconded by Makin and carried that the Finance Committee arrange for the annual audit.

The Council then listened to remarks by Clarence May relative to the Pioneer Cemetery. Mr. May spoke at some length, his opinion being, that, as a matter of civic pride, the City should do something towards the up-keep and improvement of the grounds.

Chairman Makin of Streets and P.P. committee then stated that it was the recommendation of his committee that the necessary oiling and graveling of the streets should be done by the Portland Road and Driveway Company at a cost of .30c per square yard.

Whereupon it appearing that the curb in front of the Clausen property had been replaced, but not according to requirements as set forth in a letter of instructions written by the Recorder at the request of the Council and the work not being acceptable by the Supt. of Public Works, it was decided to leave the matter in the hands of the Mayor, the City Attorney and Recorder for any further attention.

## Ordinance.

Ordinance No 352 levying a tax of \$ 5150.00 on all taxable property, both real and personal within the city limits of Canby then came up for final action and on motion, seconded and carried, place on it's final passage. Yeas 5-nays 0.

The following resolution was then introduced and on motion of Wakin, seconded by Perkett and carried, declared adopted and ordered published in the Canby Herald:

**RESOLUTION**  
 WHEREAS, heretofore new sub-divisions have been laid out and established within the City Limits of the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon; and WHEREAS, the owners of the property of such sub-divisions have called upon the City Council of Canby to furnish and install the facilities necessary to the establishing of such sub-divisions of water mains, fire hydrants, electric and power lines; and  
 WHEREAS, the expense of installing such facilities as above without remuneration or protection from the property owners laying out such sub-division creates too great an expense and burden upon the City of Canby, unless protected and guaranteed to the recovery of such expense;  
 THEREFORE, to avoid the expense and burden of installing such facilities without remuneration or protection for the recovery thereof, it is the intention of the City Council to introduce an ordinance restricting the use of City funds for the development of new tracts or sub-divisions in the laying and installation of water mains, fire hydrants, electric and power lines, without remuneration from the owners thereof, and setting forth in such ordinance certain requirements to be met by the owners of the real property contemplated to be subdivided prior to the allocation of city funds for such facilities.  
 BE IT RESOLVED that this resolution be published in the Canby Herald and recorded in the minutes of the City Recorder.  
 By order of the City Council of Canby, Oregon.

It then appearing that it might be well to investigate the advisability of continuing the matter of carrying accident insurance for the members of the Fire Department, under the State Industrial Accident Commission or with some other agency, after some discussion, it was decided to leave this to the committee in charge and the fire chief for additional information.

In the matter of house numbering the Committee reported no progress, but recommended that the job be done by some individual or individuals employed by the City for that purpose.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
