Special Meeting V -ch 20-1947

A special meeting of the Council was held on March 20 and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, City Engineer Ralph Miln and Councilmen Dedman, Cutsforth, Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Perkett and Thompson.

The mayor announced that the meeting had been called chiefly, to discuss City planning and the matter of sewer disposal.

In the absence of the Recorder, notes of the meeting were kept by Mr. Makin.

The Mayor then announced that Mr. Pearson of the League of Oregon

Cities was present and would address the Council.

Mr. Pearson offered several valuable suggestions relative to future City planning, suggesting among other things, the appointment

a City Planning Commission.

Mayor Markee then informed the Council that Mr. C.E. Stewart of the Public Works Commission had told him that if the City contemplated making application for Federal funds for surveying and engineering relative to a sewer project, it should be done very shortly.

City Engineer Miln then outlined the necessary procedure to be

followed To pass Resolution that the City request the Government Public Works Commission to proceed with survey.

2. Secure tenative estimate of Cost.

3. Make plans and specifications. 4. Government to allocate plans.

5. Arrange to finance on completion of system.

It was then moved by Perkett, seconded by Eversole and carried, that the Mayor appoint a committee to meet with the City Engineer

to rush plans to the Public Works Commission for sewer survey. The Mayor then appointed to serve, the following: Messrs. Neal Thompson, Rex Eversole, Frank Cutsforth, Glen Makin, City Treasurer

wangus and the Mayor ex officio.

It was then moved by Eversole, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that Neal Thompson be empowered to act in making better arrangements towards longer open hours for the City Dumping grounds, the better to serve the community.

Mayor Markee then stated that the time for an annual clean up of the City was approaching and at the next meeting he would announce

the day or days for that purpose.

Whereupon Councilman Thompson then reported on the condition of the streets of the City, explaining for the benefit of the citizens present, reasons for enforcing the regulations as set out in the city charter, relative to the acceptance of new sub-divisions and plats.

It was then moved, seconded and carried, that the meeting adjourn.
