## April 7-1947 ar Monthly Meeting

The Council met in regular session on Monday, April 7 and was

called to order shortly after 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Kendall,
the Recorder, Supt. Lent and all councilmen.

The minutes of the previous meeting of March 3 and those of the special meeting of March 20 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced that it might be well to suspend the reg-

ular order of business and bring up other matters.
Whereupon Mr. Wilson, representing Piepenbrook and Kron, Public Accountants read the report of his findings in the course of his

examination of the City books and accounts.
On the completion of the report, Mr. Makin moved, seconded by Thompson and carried that the report be accepted and that Mr. Wilson be excused; also that the report be studied by the Finance Committee and if any more information was required to again contact Mr. Wilson, who had previously stated that he would be very glad to answer any and all questions relative to same.

Whereupon Supt. Lent then reported on various accidents, which had happened recently, resulting in damages to City property and on motion of Makin, seconded by Perkett and carried, the City Attorney was instructed to proceed in the matter of recovery.

Mr. Lent also reported that poles were being purchased from Ernest

Russell and that a contract should be drawn covering same.

He also stated that the water tank should be cleaned and that this would be done on April 17, if no objection and that the water supply would be cut off from nine to about twelve o'clock P.M.

Whereupon Mrs. GeraldBair on behalf of the Recreation Committee

addressed the Council, asking if a building could be placed on the

City Park property, providing one was acquired.
On motion of Thompson, seconded by Eversole and carried, it was voted to grant the above request, as soon as actual title should be acquired by the City; furthermore to leave the matter in the hands of the Park committee to work with the Recreation Committee.

Whereupon at this point considerable time was used in discussing, with Messrs. Dreher, Cole and Rasmussen, the matter of platting the

Tod Wait property, recently purchased by these men.

#### Communications

The Recorder read a letter from the Canby Chamber of Commerce, relative to traffic control in the City and especially on the Highway and offering various suggestions and recommendations.

The City Treasurer then presented and read his reports for the first quarter, the same being accepted subject to audit by the

Finance Committee.

Fire Chief Yoder stated that March had been very quiet in so far as fires were concerned, there having been but two calls, with no damage suffered.

## Ordinance # 344

Ordinance No. 344, ordering payment to the Volunteer Fire Dept. for one -half the cost ( \$200.00) of the "Resucitor", recently purchased by them was then passed on it's first reading and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting.

Mayor Markee then announced that he would designate the week from April 14 to the 19th. as "Clean-up" week and that trucks would haul away rubbish on the 21st and 22nd.

He appointed Councilmen Kraft and Perkett to cooperate with members from the Kiwanis and Chamber of Commerce in overseeing and
