Regular Monthly Meeting Jay 5-1947

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, May 5, 1947 and called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Attorney Zimmerman, Supt. Lent, the pe-corder and all councilmen with the exception of Mr. Krueger. The minutes of the previous meeting of April 7 and those of the special meeting of April 21 were read and approved.

Communications

The Recorder read a letter from the State Fire Marshall calling attention to the annual convention about to be held and asking for a good representation from our City.

In connection with this, it was moved by Cutsforth, seconded by Perkett and carried, that the sum of \$ 100.00 be allowed towards the

expenses of the firemen attending the convention.

A communication from the Canby Chamber of Commerce was then read, in which they stated that they were sponsoring an Amateur Night for the purpose of raising funds for the Rose Festival float and calling for entertainers from each civic group.

Also a letter from the State Highway Commission acknowledging

our request to the State Speed Control Board for speed zoning on Highway through Canby and stating it would have consideration at

their next meeting.

Also letter from State Highway Commission relative to the release to the City of the old section of the Highway in the south part of Canby and stating that the legal formalities had been started.

The Recorder then read a communication from Frank Kendall in which he stated that he wished to be relieved from duties as Chief of Police and nightwatchman; whereupon on motion by Makin, seconded and carried, the resignation was accepted as of June first, his

salary to terminated at that time.
The Council then listened to a request from Gus Hockett for permission to operate a taxi-cab in Canby and asking for a franchise.

On motion by Makin, seconded by Cutsforth and carried it was voted that Mr. Hoskett be granted permit to operate, when and if Oscar Davis gives a written statement that he does not intend to continue operations under the license allowed him .

Reports

Geo. Koehler, street commissioner reported that various citizens were asking that gravel be placed on streets in front of their property; also that complaints had been made that some people were using the streets as a dumping ground and that drivers of logging trucks were not confining themselves to the properw routes.

These matters were left to the proper committees and it was suggested that the Recorder write letters to the owners of the two sawmills requesting that they have the truck drivers use the proper

streets previously designated.

Mr. perkett for the Water and Light Committee then reported that 1500' of 6" pipe and 1000' of 4" had been purchased for approximately \$2600 and estimated it would be necessary to but an additional 3500' of 6" and 6000' of 4", estimated cost \$9000.

Whereupon it appearing that the bid of the Waterworks Supply Co was the most reasonable, on motion of pedman, seconded by Cutsforth and a poll vote taken, the Council decided to accept the bid of the above mentioned company for 3500' of 6" pipe at \$ 95.75 and 6000' of 4" at 73.55 including couplings; 10 gage dipped and wrapped; necessary fittings to be ordered at discretion of committee.

It was then moved by Eversole, seconded and carried that the Recorder write other pipe bidders, thanking them for their interest

in the matter.

Mr. Perkett also reported having a bid of \$\psi\$ 700 fpr painting water tank. He furthermore suggested that there should be a map of the water system and on motion of Thompson seconded by Dedman and carried, the Water committee was instructed to have one made.

The Finance Committee then presented the following report: On Tuesday night, April 15, the Committee (Mr. Makin, Craig pedman Ed. Krueger being Absent) met with Auditor Wilson, Mayor Markee, City Treasurer Mangus and Curtis Johnson, Sr.

It was decided to present the following recommendations to the Council to take effect at the beginning of the next fiscal year:

Whereupon, Chairman Eversole of the Police Committee reported that his committee was recommending the following set-up of fines to be charged by the Recorder for violations of traffic laws:

- Mirimum # 5.00 plus # 2.50 costs Minor offences Speeding- 1.00 per mile for each mile over the limit Reckless driving- Minimum 25.00- 5.00 costs Bad brakes - 5.00 -costs 2.50 Absence of tail lights-warning- \$5.00 and 2.50 to be refunded when showing receipt for correction. Drunk and disorderly \$ 25.00 costs \$ 5.00

The Committee also recommended purchase of a prowl car.

It was then moved by Makin, seconded by Thompson and carried, that this report be approved, including the purchase of a prowl car. Chairman Thompson of the Street Committee reported having instructed Mr. Koehler to grade and gravel where necessary and introduced the

following Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT before the Council shall accept any street or right of way laid out for public use, they shall conform to previous City Charter regulations; also such other regulations as the Council, City Engineer and street superintendent may require in each separate plat, deed, gift, extension or any other manner by which the Council acquire them. No street shall be accepted unless it is made to conform with the city engineer's specifications.

All rock must be crushed to size, inch minus, inch and a quarter

minus, or smaller, unless specified differently by the City Engineer.

All rock must be spread in a twenty foot band in the center of right of way, not less than three inches deep on all new streets; the Council, City Engineer or Street Superintendent may require more than a tree inch depth of rock on any new street they believe requires a deeper rock base.

On motion, seconded and carried the above Pesolution was adopted.

Whereupon Fire Chief Yoder reported four calls in Apral with only slight damages.

It was then voted to accept the deeds from Elmer Zeek and Fred

and John Stefani, subject to approval by City Attorney. It was also voted to return Hardware Mutual insurance policy

covering City Hall to be written for a straight sum of \$13500. The Mayor then appointed May 19 as a date to meet with the

Budget Committee.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.

Special Meeting/Friday, May 9-1947

Meeting called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Treasurer Mangus-The Recorder and all Councilmen with the exception of Mr. Krueger.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the matter of a survey relative to the installation of a sewer system and disposal plant, it being understood that Federal funds were available for that purpose.

Mayor Markee then introduced Mr. Stewart of the Federal Works

Administration, who proceeded to explain to the members under what

conditions and requirements, the funds could be advanced, etc.

Whereupon on motion of Makin, seconded by Eversole and carried,
it was voted to apply to the Federal Works Agency for funds for surveying and engineering for a sewer and disposal plant for the City.

A vote of a number of citizens present was also unanimously in

favor of this action.

The following Resolution was then introduced and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted.

- 2. Set up a warrant register and cash receipt book.
- 3. Treasurer or assistant treasurer to take over all bookkeeping for the City, including books now kept by the Bonneville Power Adm.
- 4. Set up separate water department set of books. Get appraisal of water system.
- 5. Establish budget register book.
- 6. Establish a Petty Cash Fund for water and light departments of \$ 100.00 each. (Council to instruct the bank).
- 7. Change bonding of city employees to conform with Charter.
