

Regular Monthly Meeting  
Monday, June 2-1947

The Council met in regular session on Monday, June 2-1947 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, Attorney Zimmerman, Supt. Lent, the Recorder and Councilmen Outsforth, Eversole, Dedman, Kraft, Makin and Perkett. Absent-Krueger and Thompson.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 5 and those of the special meeting of May 9 were read and approved.

The Mayor then stated that the usual order of business would be suspended and the Council would listen to Mr. Koehler the Street Commissioner who had a few matters to bring up.

Mr. Koehler then stated that the Southern Pacific Co. had erected several cabins fronting on the eastern extension of First street and blocking the ditch there, thus causing a flood hazard. He also stated that on Molalla Avenue beyond the Telephone office and on several other properties, sidewalks should be rebuilt.

Mayor Markee then introduced Mr. Jerry Sailer, Executive Secretary of the Public Employee's Retirement Fund, who had been asked to attend this meeting and explain the workings of the system.

This, Mr. Sailer proceeded to do in a very able manner, afterwards answering many questions put to him by the members.

The Council then proceeded to take up the regular order of business, and the Recorder read a petition signed by twenty residents, asking that immediate attention be given to the conditions prevailing on Third Avenue from Ivy street running towards the Fair Grounds and also on Knott street, where in both cases the dust situation was deplorable.

This was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Another petition was presented signed by various citizens, asking that the owners of the Canby Auto Wreckers business be instructed to erect a wooden fence, not less than seven feet in height, around their property, the same to be painted and kept in good repair at all times.

In connection with this, it was moved by Perkett, seconded by Dedman and carried, that the Recorder write Mrs. Crosson, requesting her to erect such a fence and shut off the unsightly view from the public gaze.

Communications

The Recorder read a letter from Butler and Jack, attorneys, relative to streets through the Oliver and Zacher properties and was instructed to answer same, with the help of the City Attorney.

## Reports

Supt. Lent reported that the claim for damages against Robt. Du Rette for \$ 24.88 had not yet been paid and recommended suit.

Whereupon on motion of Makin, seconded by Perkett and carried, it was voted to commence legal proceedings.

Mr. Lent also reported that considerable work had been done on electric lines in the N/W part of town and called attention to the fact that the water pipes on Third Avenue should be removed before improvements were started.

Chairman Perkett of the Water Committee then reported that many new customers had been cut-in and stated that in seventeen cases the cost had averaged \$ 35.00 each, while under the ordinance governing this matter, the customer could only be charged \$ 10.00.

The Committee therefore recommended that this charge for cut-ins be raised to \$ 30.00. Mr. Perkett, for his Committee also advised the purchase of a pump, at a cost of about \$ 180.00, for the purpose of pumping out mains and ditches.

Whereupon it was moved, seconded and carried that the pump be bought.

It was then moved by Makin, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that an Ordinance ( No. 347) be introduced and that this shall be considered the first reading, changing and amending Ordinance # 313, making the charge for water connections \$ 30.00 instead of \$ 10.00.

Said Ordinance to be published in the usual manner.

Fire Chief Yoder then made a short verbal report: two calls in May, one to the Fair Grounds and the other to the Thiel farm, where the dwelling was destroyed; he also stated that the newly purchased recusatator had been used in the case of a drowning in the Pudding River, but with no results, as the victim had been too long immersed.

Mr. Yoder also reported the Hood River convention as having been very interesting and instructive. Also spoke of the recently formed rural fire district ~~formed~~ here and that a map of same was being prepared.

At this point, Mayor Markee stated that he would appoint a Charter Revision Committee and named the following: Chairman Zimmerman, and Messrs. Makin, Eversole, Evans and the Mayor ex officio.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the request of F.R. Galbraith for a two weeks vacation, with pay, be granted.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the proposed Budget for the City for the fiscal year-July 1-1947 to June 30-1948 be published in the Canby Herald for two consecutive weeks and that a meeting be held by the Levying Board in the City Hall at 1 o'clock P.M. June 26, at which time any person objecting thereto will be heard; the Board will then proceed to discuss the proposed levy and to determine and declare the Budget for the fiscal year.



Whereupon a certain Resolution, prepared by the State Highway Commission and relative to the return to the jurisdiction of the City, the old section of the Highway in the S/W part of town, was presented for the consideration of the Council.

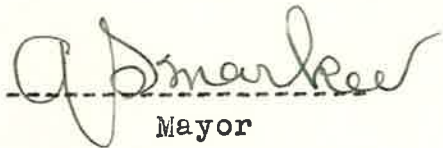

#### Ordinances

Ordinance No. 345 segregating the Light Fund from the Water Fund and Ordinance No. 346 authorizing the purchase of a prowler car were than both passed on their first readings and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on July 7.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
