

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, August 4-1947

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, August 4, 1947 and was called to order at the usual time.

Present at roll call- Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Wakin, Monahan, Perkett, Thompson and Cutsforth. Mayor Markee, Atty Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, Supt. Lent and the Recorder.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Communications.

The Recorder read a letter from the Oregon Assn. of City Police Officers asking if Canby expected to be represented at the training School to be held in September.

There was also presented a proposal by the Recreation Commission, that the City provide the footing and slab for the Quanset hut to be set up on the Park property.

Also communication from League of Oregon Cities relative to the appropriations of state highway revenues to cities.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the salary of Mrs. Weston be paid as follows: 75% from the Light Fund and 25% from the Water Fund; also that the cost of office supplies be divided in the same manner.

Reports

Fire Chief Yoder reported four calls in July of no great importance; also reported the Rose fire on Aug. 3, with about \$ 1500 loss on dwelling and \$ 1000 on household goods.

He also stated that a fire school would be held at Corvallis in September and that he thought it advisable for some member of the department to attend and suggested that the City bear the expense or, at least, part of it.

In connection with this, it was moved by Cutsforth, seconded by Makin and carried, that the sum of \$ 30.00 be paid by the City to help defray the expenses of a delegate.

Chief Yoder also suggested that a charge of \$ 5.00 be made to persons desiring the services of the Department while burning off dry grass and weeds.

Chief of police Hudson submitted a report covering his various activities for the month in detail.

Supt. Lent reported various extensions underway and that probably it would be necessary to order more wire soon; also that he would be glad to assist his successor in office, if and when he should be called upon.

Committee Reports

The Chairman of the Finance Committee reported that the City Treasurer's reports for the second quarter had been found satisfactory.

Chairman Perkett of the Fire and Water committee stated that no estimate had yet been received for painting the water tank, although the job should be done before long.

Chairman Thompson of Streets and Public Property stated in regard to the Clausen plat, he had asked that it be turned over to Mr. Milln, who would advise the Council.

He also reported that Oliver and Zacher were waiting for the City to grade the streets in their addition, stating that they would stand one-half the expense. Committee would not agree to this, but might possible help.

Whereupon at this point, Mayor Markee suggested that Mr. Thompson's committee have a sign reading " City Hall" installed on building and that some re-decorating be done.

Mr. Makin, chairman of the committee to consider and recommend a successor to Mr. Lent reported that many applications had been received, but these had been simmered down to 4 or 5, who had met with the committee, who now were prepared to recommend the appointment of Carl Raines at a salary of \$ 350.00 per month and whose title would be " Supt. of Public Works".

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that the committee's recommendation be adopted and that Mr. Raines be so appointed, to take over september 1st.

Ordinances

Ordinance No. 347 increasing the cost of water connections then came up for final action and was passed by unanimous vote-Yeas 8 nays 0

Atty Zimmerman then suggested that the Recorder write to the County Court, asking for some decision relative to the City Park taxes.

It then appearing that the deed to the street in front of the High School required many signatures and that it would be necessary to send it out of the city for some, it was moved, seconded and carried that the sum of \$ 3.00 be allowed for Notary fees in the matter.

No other business appearing, the meeting then adjourned.
