Regular Monthly Meeting Ionday, Sept. 2-1947

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, Sept. 2 and the

meeting was called to order at the usual time.

Those answering roll call were-Mayor Markee, Atty Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Perkett. Councilmen Monahan and Thompson reported later and Councilman Cutsforth was absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August 4 were read and

approved.

Communications

The Recorder read a communication from the State Highway Department calling attention to the \$250000.00 fund set up under Chapter 371 of Oregon Laws to be disbursed to small cities, under certain conditions, where the wear and tear on the streets by state licensed trucks is excessive.

A letter was received from Mrs. Faye Brace asking for license to

The resignation of Harry Lehman as nightwatchman was also read. The following bills and claims against the City were then presented and on motion, seconded and carried ordered paid and warrants drawn:

Repults of officers

Supt. Lent reported on activities at the Fair Groungs and having trouble collecting framone of the concessionaires.

Fire Chief reported on three fires during the month , with small lossess. Also stated that the Fire Commission inspector had been active and had ordered fire escapes installed in several cases.

Chief Yoder also stated that apparently it would not be possible for any of the firemen to attend the Fire School to be held shortly.

The report of Chief of Police Hudson was read by the Recorder

and covered very completely his activities for the month, showing number of arrests made, doors found unlocked, merchandise left out at night and many other things.

In connection with this report, Mayor Markee spoke at some length, relative to police activities, stating that in the case of traffice violations and resulting fines, it was not the idea to make a profit, but to be helpful to the public, especially in lessening the danger of accidents.

Reports of Committees

Councilman Eversole reported in the matter of selecting an engineer

and surveyor for preliminary sewer work.

He stated that his committee had found the firm of Cornell, Hull, Hayes and Merrifield to be highly recommended by many and that having considered the matter thoroughly, was prepared to recommend that they be retained by the Council.

Whereupon it was moved by Thompson, seconded by Krueger and carried that the report of the committee be adopted and that the above named

firm be employed to do the surveying and engineering work necessary
Mr. Makin for the Finance Committee reported that they were much
pleased with the statement rendered by Mrs. Weston, showing the budget
set-up and the various expenditures to date, with resulting balance.

Mr. Perkett for the Fire and Water Committee presented a bid of

1250.00 for painting the outside of the water tank.
Mr. Raines, the newly elected Water and Light Supt. or rather Supt. of Public Works then addressed the Council, stating in his remarks, that owing to the growth of the two systems, considerable more equip-

ment was needed, especially a new line truck.
In connection with this, Mayor Markee suggested that the Committee in charge confer with Mr. Raines and report back to the Council any

recommendations.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that Mr. Lent be retained on his salary of \$ 225.00 for the month of September, to act in an advisory capacity.

Mr. Eversole then reported on the resignation of Mr. Lehman as nighwatchman and the appointment of Mr.J.C. Dempster to succeed him,

this appointment to be of a temporary nature at present.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to adjourn to meet on Monday, Sept. 8 at the usual hour.
