## Adjourned Meeting nday, Sept. 8-1947

A meeting of the Council, adjourned from Sept. 2 was held on

Monday, Sept. 8 and called to order at the usual time.
Present-Mayor Markee and Councilmen Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Monahan, Perkett and Thompson. Also Massrs. C.E. Johnson and J.R. Vinyard and Mr. Cornell of the firm of Cornell, Hull, Hayes and Merrifield.

Mayor Markee announced that the principal reason for meeting was to take up and consider the matter of engineering and surveying for

the proposed sewer system and disposal plant.

Mr. Cornell then addressed the Council, presenting his ideas as

to the proper procedure, some of which were as follows:

Make a preliminary survey of the whole city-prepare maps-estimate
in so far as possible the direction of future growth- choose a probable site for a disposal plant and prepare estimate of costs.

Mr. Cornell also stated that he would have drawn up a contract

to be signed after due consideration.

The Recorder was also asked to write the Secretary of the League of Oregon Cities for a copy of an ordinance relative to setting up a monthly charge on each consumer's water bill, to provide a fund

for future sewage developement. The Recorder then read a letter from the Dietrict Attorney, which stated that the County Court would cancel the item of \$ 504.43 interest charges on the Park property taxes and would accept the original sum of \$ 581.33 representing the back taxes when the City took

over.

Whereupon it was moved by Makin, seconded by Eversole and carried, that the City Treasurer be instructed to issue a check for General

Fund warrant No. 6090, dated Febr. 6, 1945 for the above amount.

Mr. Makin then presented and read four bids for the installation of an oil furnace, or rather the conversion of the present one in the City Hall. The bid of the Canby Plumbing and Heating Co. seemed to be the lowest, but no action was taken, as it was thought some revisions should be made before accepting the same.

It was then moved by Thompson, seconded and carried that the

Recorder write Mr. Ralph Milln instructing him to return the deed of Mrs. DeMerrit, which he has been holding in escrow, subject to the acceptance of 6th. street.

The Recorder was also instructed to write another letter to the owners of the Canby Auto Wreckers, stating that the request of the Council that a fence be built around their property be immediately complied with.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
