

Special Meeting
Monday, Sept. 29-1947

The City Council met in special session on Monday, Sept. 29 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, the Recorder and Councilmen- Cutsforth, Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Monahan, Perkett and Thompson.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called primarily for the purpose of selecting a bookkeeper to replace Mrs. Weston, who had presented her resignation.

Mrs. Weston's letter of resignation was then read and on motion of Perkett, seconded by Cutsforth and carried was accepted.

Mr. Makin then reported that ads. had been inserted in several newspapers and that quite a few applications had been received.

He stated that the committee had carefully considered and checked the applications and had decided to recommend the appointment of Mr. A.F. Hayworth. Whereupon, Mr. Hayworth, being without, was asked to come in and was then interviewed personally.


He then retired and a vote being taken by the Council resulted in six votes for Mr. Hayworth and two for J.L. Eckerson.

Chairman Perkett of the Light and Water Committee then recommended that Mr. Lent be asked to stay on the job for at least two weeks in October at his present salary. Moved, seconded and carried.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the bid of the Canby Plumbing and Heating Co. for the installation of an oil furnace for the City Hall be accepted. The same to be a Montag burner, Honeywell thermostadt control with 1000 gal. tank to be two feet underground.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
