

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday-October 6, 1947

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, Oct. 6 and was called to order at the usual hour.

Present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Carl Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen-Cutsforth, Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Monahan and Perkett. Absent Thompson.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Sept. 2, the adjourned meeting of Sept. 9 and the special meeting of Sept. 29 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced that the regular order of business would be suspended and the proposed street program for the year would be discussed. The Street Committee then presented the following list of streets to be improved and Street Commissioner Koehler outlined the suggested work to be done:

3rd. Street-from Ivy 3 blocks north to Locust

Juniper-2nd. to 3rd.

Second St.-Juniper to Ivy

First St. - Elm to Douglas

Douglas-First to Second

Street running east from Kozy Korner-from first corner about 3 blocks north and 3 blocks east-both to city limits.

"M" st. (south of Highway 99) to Cemetery Road to East 2nd.

Knight's Bridge Road between old Hampton house and Perry Road on 5th. Street.

Cedar St. to Fir

Fir St.-4th. to 5th.

Widening of street in Clausen addition

Possible improvements-2nd. st. Elm to Ivy

Also 5th. street on South side.

Estimated cost approximately \$ 8000, of which probably about \$ 6000 would be coming from the State during the fiscal year.

It was suggested that the Street Committee and Mr. Koehler inspect the proposed improvements, together with other members of the Council.

Reports

City Treasurer presented and read his reports for the quarter ending Sept. 30, the same being accepted, subject to audit by the Finance Com.

The Recorder reported 71 cases in his court during the month, with fines assessed in the sum of \$ 664.50, including costs of \$ 169.50.

The report of Chief of Police Hudson showing in detail his activities during September was read by the Recorder.

Fire Chief Yoder reported only two calls, with no material damage.

He also demonstrated the oxygen tank and mask recently purchased at a cost of \$ 160.00.

Supt. Raines reported the laying and covering of 2282 feet of four and six inch water pipe.

In connection with this, Mr. Lent recommended the employment of Mr. Gahler in the future, as his work had been very satisfactory, both as to price and performance.

Mr. Galbraith reported having resingled the chicken house on the cemetery property, also one coat of paint on the dwelling.

He also presented an invitation to attend a meeting of the newly formed Oregon Interment Assn. This matter left to Cemetery Com.

Fred Stefani, Chairman of the "Flight Strip" Committee recently appointed by the Mayor reported that he had contacted a Mr. Ken Blais of Eugene, who might be interested in maintaining the field under a long term lease, providing the City should decide to take it over.

Mr. Stefani stated that all airports in the vicinity of Portland were heavily loaded and that in his opinion the matter of acquiring title to the one in question should have careful consideration by the Council, possibly not for any immediate use, but for future developments. It was decided to leave the matter to the committee for further investigation as to the financial responsibility of Mr. Blais and also for further details.

Communications.

A letter from the Clackamas County Fair Board was read, in which the City was thanked for it's cooperation during the recent session of the fair.

Letter from the District Attorney stating that the County Court was cancelling the interest charges on the Park property back taxes and would accept in full payment the sum of \$ 581.33.

Letter from the City of La Grande inviting officials of Canby to attend the convention of the League of Oregon Cities.

Petition from various citizens for improvements on streets (already on program as previously mentioned.

Letter from office of League of Oregon Cities relative to sewer service charges, etc. and enclosing copies of ordinances passed by the cities of Tillamook and Sweet Home.

Whereupon Councilman Perkett reported that the laying of water pipe recently installed cost an average of .40 per foot.

Supt. Raines suggested that it might be possible to purchase transformers from other than the Maloney Electric Co., who could not deliver at present. Also recommended that in case of stoppage of meter, bill should be averaged from previous ones. Approved.

Also that where customers temporary sets were installed there was some question as to the proper charge. Left to Committee.

Mr. Raines then asked for the privilege of making arrangements for a week's hunting, providing he could get his work in shape. Approved.

Councilman Kraft then bro't up the matter of new uniforms for the police force and on motion of Makin, seconded by Cutsforth, it was voted that the Chief and his assistant should each be authorized to purchase coat-two pair pants and hat.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
