## Special Meeting \_\_to. 27-1947

The City Council met in special session on Monday, October 27,

and was called to order at 8.30 P. M. On roll call there were present: Mayor Markee, Atty. Zimmerman, the Recorder and Councilmen Cutsforth, Eversole, Krueger, Makin, Monahan and Perkett. Absent Kraft and Thompson.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called primarily to meet with Mr. Cornell of the engineering firm of Cornell, Hull, Hayes and Merrifield and to discuss the proposed contract to be signed by the City and the above named firm, relative to the surveying and engineering work in connection with the construction of a sewage system and disposal plant.

Mr. Cornell then proceeded to read the contract, paragraph by paragraph, stopping at various places, where the members wished to ask questions or discuss certain points.

The contract, as a whole, seemed to be quite satisfactory to the Council, but as some revisions were deemed necessary and desirable, Mr. Cornell stated that he would have the changes made and four copies returned for the approval of the members at the next regular meeting to be held on November 3, at which time, if agreeable, they could be signed by the proper officials.

Some discussion then ensued, regarding the carrying on of the city work during the absence of Carl Raines, who would no doubt be incapacitated for some time. However, no action was taken, and it was decided to leave the matter in the hands of the proper committee.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
