Also a report of the meeting of representatives from Clackamas Co.
cities, held in Oregon City, November 4, at which meeting there was discussed the various problems of the cities, to present to the Legislative Interim Committee appointed by the last Legislature.

On motion of Makin, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to allow Garmire 2 weeks vacation money (\$87.50). (included in above).

Mayor Markee then announced that the regular order of business would

be suspended and visitors would be heard.

Mr. Beck and Mr. Geo. Berg being present and representing the Grade School stated that another addition to the school was about to be started and it was necessary to have an understanding relative to the closing of 5th. and 6th. streets and alley between.4th. and 5th.

After a long discussion, it was moved by Makin, seconded by Eversole and carried, that an Ordinance be drawn ordering the closing of 5th.

street between Grant and Fir sts. and vacating the alley between 4th and 5th. sts. from Grant to Fir; the School District to assume the expense of moving the water pipe now on 5th. between Grant and Fir sts to Fir street between 4th. and 5th. sts.

Whereupon concerning the water supply condition at the Cemetery, John Beck stated that it would be impossible to do much with the present well and that the pump was inadequate. He suggested a new well to be located more than fifty feet from any graves and that there would be plenty of water at 120 to 150 feet depth. He estimated the cost of an 8" well to be about \$ 1200 complete and and thought he knew of a pump that could be bo't for \$ 800.00. He also stated that for a 6" well, the cost would be \$ 4.50 per foot. (Left to Committee).

Reports of Officers

Chief of Police Hudson presented a detailed report of his activities

for the month, the same being read by the Recorder.

The Recorder reported 52 cases in his Court during the month, resulting in fines assessed of # 537.50 including costs of # 127.50.

Fire Chief Yoder reported the Leslie Skinner fire with a loss of about \$ 450 with no insurance.

At this point, Mayor Markee announced that he had appointed Mr. Johnson as Chairman of the Finance Committee and to serve on the Park committee; Mr Makin to take over the Chairmanship of the committee on Streets and Public Property.

Reports of Committees

Chairman Cutsforth of the Cemetery Committee in his report submitted the following recommendations:

That Garetaker Galbraith be placed on a flat salary of \$ 190.00 per month in addition to use of dwelling and grounds.

He also stated that the wiring of building and the matter of a new well or other water system was being given consideration.

The Committee also favored the program as outlined by the caretaker and which included the following improvements: Seeding of lots in old cemetery (to be paid for by owners) Removal of shrubs and trees out of line with monuments.

Removal of high curbs so as not to interfere with use of power mower. Whereupon on motion of Makin, seconded by Johnson and carried, the above report and recommendations were accepted by the Council, to take effect as on January 1, 1948.

Chairman Makin of Streets and public Property reported complaints of standing water in places and recommended dry well at 4th. and Fir. Request for gravel in alley in rear of Giger residence. (not allowed) Gordon Weygandt asks for two culverts installed. This not recommended as would simply dump water on property of others.

Dry well at 3rd and 4th should be cleaned out, also at Shell Station.

Dry well near Rose residence recommended.

Recommended gravel at Civic Club hall, on Fir street back of Arestad and on 2nd at blacksmith shop. Gravel and tile needed on Mueller road and tile near city dump needs cleaning out.
Chr. Perkett reported figures on appraisal of water system should

be ready by next meeting.

Moved, seconded and carried that appointment of Mrs. Decker by committee be confirmed. Supt . Raines was instructed to place order for four more transformers.
