

Regular Monthly Meeting  
Monday, Jan. 6, 1947

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, January 6, 1947 and was called to order at 8.15 by Mayor Vinyard.  
Present: Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Dent, Supt. Lent, Recorder Evans and Councilmen-Cutsforth, Dedman, Eversole, Kraft, Makin, Perkett and Thompson. Absent, Krueger.

The Recorder announced that all the newly elected councilmen had taken the oath of office and were entitled to be seated.

The minutes of the previous meeting of December were then read and approved.

Communications.

Under this head, the Recorder read a letter from the Bonneville Power Administration relative to the opening of a new account on the City Treasurer's books of a Light Dept. Sinking Fund.

A request was received and read from the Hi-Way Market of this city, asking a license be granted them for the sale of package beer in accordance with the state law.

Whereupon, at this stage of the proceedings, Mayor Vinyard announced that it would be in order to elect a President of the Council and asked for the wishes of the members.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that Mr. Cutsforth be chosen for that position and there being no other nominees, he was declared unanimously elected.

Mr. Vinyard then presented his resignation as Mayor and Mr. Cutsforth took the chair.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the application of the Hi-Way Market be tabled for the present.

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The Council then proceeded to the election of Mayor to serve for two years, Mr. Arestad having failed to qualify and Mayor Vinyard having presented his resignation.

Councilman Dedman then placed in nomination the name of A.S. Markee and on motion of Makin, seconded and carried, the nominations were declared closed and Mr. Markee was unanimously chosen for the office.

It was then moved by Dedman, seconded by Eversole and carried, that Geo. Koehler be appointed Street Commissioner, his compensation to be fixed later.

#### Reports

City Treasurer Mangus then read his reports for the last quarter and also for the year and on motion, seconded and carried they were accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Fire Chief Yoder reported one call in December-Pfister residence. He also reported forty one calls in 1946, the property involved having a value of \$ 120720.00, with losses of \$ 11370.00.

Yoder then stated that the Fire department had purchased a "Resuscitator", which he proceeded to demonstrate to the Council, and suggested that the City might wish to be a part owner.

Whereupon it was moved by Makin, seconded by Dedman and carried that half the cost of it be paid by the City; also that it be placed and kept on the rural fire truck and that the Fire department be responsible for it's safekeeping and use.

It then appearing that Mr. Davis had asked for a parking space on Grant Street near First for his proposed taxi service, the matter was left to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Also the matter of the Baker pipe line was left to the same com. Whereupon, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting then adjourned to meet on Monday, January 13 at 8 o'clock P.M.
