## Regular Monthly Meeting Febr. 3-1947

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, Febr. 3, 1947 and was called to order shortly after ' o'clock P.M. by Mayor Markee. Present: His Honor, the Mayor, City Attorney Zimmerman, Supt. Lent, Nightwatchman Kendall, Fire Chief Yoder, Recorder Evans and Council-men-Cutsforth, Dedman, Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Makin, Perkett and Thompson.

The minutes of the previous meetings of January 6 and 13 were

read and approved.

It was then moved by Makin, seconded by Dedman and carried that the order for the payment of half the cost of the "Resuscitator" recently purchased by the firemen be rescinded for the present.

The Mayor then announced that the regular order of business

would be suspended and the Council would consult with Mr. Milln

relative to the Oliver plat and other matters requiring his advice.

After considerable time consumed with the above, Mr. pedman stated that Messrs. Hittle and Peebles of the Bonneville Power Administration were present and that anything they might have to say would undoubtedly be of interest to the members.

Mr. Peebles then addressed the Council and at once bro't up the matter of overloaded lines; stating that he recognized the fact that Canby was having it's troubles, but that there were many other towns and cities in the same boat.

He stated that, in his opinion, if the City contemplated space heating, standard equipment and insulation should be required; rates should be established and penalty provided for non-conformity to rules and regulations. He suggested that the City should be careful in proceeding in this matter and that it might be well to run ads in the local paper, that the public might be kept informed as to present conditions

Mr. Peebles concluded by saying that his department would be

very glad to work with the City in any way they might be helpfuld.

Considerable information was also imparted by their Auditor, relative to a proposed set-up of a system of book-keeping for the City.

Communications. Under this head, the Recorder read a letter from Mr. Milln, relative to the street in front of the High School; also one from the Chamber of Commerce regarding their efforts to obtain different traffice lights on the Highway.
