

Regular Monthly Meeting
March 3-1947

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 3, and was called to order shortly after 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Markee, City Attorney Zimmerman, the Recorder and Councilmen Cutsforth, Dedman, Eversole, Kraft, Krueger, Perkett and Thompson. Absent Makin.

The minutes of the previous meeting of February 3 and adjourned meeting of February 10 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced that the regular order of business would be suspended and stated that Mr. Herman Kehlery, Executive Secretary of the League of Oregon Cities was present on invitation and would address the members, more particularly relative to the matter of a new city charter.

Mr. Kehlery stated that in recent years, many state laws had been passed, tending to make city charters obsolete and that quite a few cities had adopted entirely new charters in the last few years.

He suggested that, if Canby contemplated such a proceeding, a committee be appointed for the purpose, composed of members of the Council and citizens of Canby; he recommended the Committee to be limited to about seven.

He also stated that there were two ways to proceed; either to adopt an entirely new charter or to amend the old one, so that it would be in line with present State laws.

Mr. Kehlery spoke at some length, answered many questions and again promised any assistance required.

Communications

The regular course of business was then resumed and under this head the Recorder read a letter from the Canby Lumber Company, asking that the City take over the transformers now installed at the mill site and order others more powerful.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the Recorder answer the letter, rejecting the offer and stating that if they desired to sign a contract and advance the cost of new transformers required, an order for them could be placed.

Various letters from members of the Legislature were read; these were in answer to protests forwarded relative to H.B. #150.

Also a letter from the local W.C.T.U. protesting the sale of liquor in the city, where food is also sold.

It was then moved by Dedman, seconded and carried that the Clausen-Arestad plat be left to the consideration of the Committee on Streets and Public Property.
