

Regular Monthly Meeting  
City Council  
Monday, July 1-1946

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council of Canby was held on Monday, July 1, 1946 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Evans and City Attorney Ralph Zimmerman. Councilmen Berg, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter and Reynolds.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of June 3 and those of the special meeting of June 17 were read and approved.

Communications

Under this head, the Recorder read a letter from the directors of School District # 86, asking for a permanent easement of conveyance of that certain street running through the school property, and used by the school for sometime past under a temporary easement.

Also a communication from the President and Secretary of the local W.C.T.U. requesting the Council to use it's influence against the sale of beer and other liquors on the Fairgrounds during the coming fair.

At this point in the proceedings, Mayor Vinyard announced the presence of Jerry Saylor, Executive Secretary of the Employee's Public Retirement System and that Mr. Saylor had been invited to meet with the Council and to explain the workings of the System.

Whereupon Mr. Saylor addressed the meeting, going into details in a very lucid manner and answering many questions fired at him by the members. After Mr. Saylor's departure it was decided to postpone action on the matter at this time.

Whereupon Mr. M.A.Larson, being present asked for information concerning the opening of a street through his property, the matter having been considered at a previous meeting. It appeared that no deed had been presented as yet and until this was done, no action could be taken by the Council.

Mr. Berg and Mr. Yergen from the School Board of District # 86 were also present and asked for an expression from the members as to the permanent closing of the street above mentioned. After a lengthy discussion and much pouring over the map to find out just what property the school owned, they were advised that the Council seemed to favor their request, but that it did not seem advisable to make any binding contract until more information could be obtained.

Whereupon several citizens living in the vicinity of the Makin mill complained of the nuisance caused by logging trucks and asked if something could not be done about it, especially in the way of re-routing them. They were assured that the Council recognized their complaint as a just one, but could not promise any action at present.

Fire Chief Yoder reported quiet month. One run to Lamour's Turkey Farm. Asked again about painting hydrants, which had been ordered at a previous meeting.

Chairman Koehler of the Streets and Public Property Com. stated that the road along the entrances to the Fair Grounds was in poor condition and that the County Court had agreed to furnish the "Premix" if the City would do the work of repairing.

It was so ordered.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to sign the Torgeson Agreement relative to operating the City dump, a copy of which is hereby made a part of these minutes. *(copy filed in safe)*

Ordinance # 342

Ordinance No. 342, levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal then came up for final action and on vote of Council was passed. Yeas 5-Nays 0

Mayor Vinyard then presented a deed signed by Earl and Sabina Oliver conveying a certain strip of land to the City for road or alley purposes. On motion, seconded and carried this was accepted and ordered filed on the County records.

No other business appearing the meeting adjourned.
