

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, August 5, 1946

The City Council of Canby met in regular session on Monday, August 5, 1946 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.
Present: Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Kendall, recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen-Berg, Cutsforth, Koehler, Kraft, Porter and Stefani. Absent-Krueger and Reynolds.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July first were read and approved.

Communications

The recorder read a letter from the Bonneville Power Administration, stating that 200 more KW of electricity would be provided as requested by Mr. Lent.

At this point in the proceedings, there being several citizens present, with apparently something on their minds, Mayor Vinyard asked for their spokesman. Whereupon, John Eid, Harvey Wheeler and others, living in the neighborhood of the Makin saw-mill stated that the dust raised by the logging trucks was unbearable and appealed to the Council for some relief.

They were told that this matter would be taken up and the Council would do what they could as soon as they could.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported that the new pipe line was giving much satisfaction and keeping up the water in the tank in fine shape.

Also stated that a few transformers had been received.

Fire Chief Yoder reported two calls in July-one a grass fire along the So. Pacific right of way and the other a burning auto at New Era. Also that he had been unable to locate any paint for renewing the hydrants.

Councilman Koehler reported that he was waiting for the County equipment to improve various streets and roads, which work had been promised soon.

Mr. Koehler also stated that he appreciated the need for work in the vicinity of the Wakin saw-mill, but first desired to know that he would have the backing of the Council members.

Whereupon, on motion, seconded and carried, it was ordered that approximately three blocks in that neighborhood be graded and graveled as soon as possible.

Mr. Cutsforth of the Finance Committee then reported that the Treasurer's reports for the quarter ending June 30 had been audited and found correct.

Whereupon a contract signed by E.O. Mueller and wife, granting an easement over his property, as previously agreed upon was presented and read by the Recorder; on motion, seconded and carried, the contract was accepted, to be signed by the Mayor and Recorder and the agreed price of \$ 1000.00 paid at once to Mr. Mueller.

Mr. Mueller also presented a deed signed by himself and wife conveying to the City for road purposes, a certain portion of his property and containing 0.764 acres of land. The same was accepted by vote of the Council and ordered filed in the records of the County.

A deed signed by M.A. Larson also conveying a strip of land through his property for a public street was also presented and accepted, subject to correction, the same to be recorded when this was done.

Whereupon Mr. Mueller, still being present, entered a complaint relative to fires in the City dump, stating that in one instance fire had been started in his field from sparks and suggested that this matter should be carefully watched. Left to Committee.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
