

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, Sept. 3-1946

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, Sept. 3, and was called to order at the usual time.

Present: Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, recorder Evans and Councilmen Berg, Cutsforth, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter and Reynolds. Absent Stefani.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August 5 were read and approved.

Communications.

A letter from A.L.Beck, Supt. of schools was read in which he asked that the City help defray the expense of installing lighting equipment for the High School athletic field.

In connection with this, it was moved by Porter, seconded by Reynolds and carried that it be left to the Light committee and Supt. Lent.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported that the telephone company desired to attach it's cable to the city poles in the alley between 2nd. and 3rd. st. rather than to install another pole line.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the Light Committee and Mr. Lent meet with representatives from the telephone company to work out a solution.

Fire Chief Yoder reported 10 calls in August, mostly grass fires; also that the hydrants and strips along the curbing had been re-painted.

Street Commissioner Koehler reported primary coat of oil and gravel layed on various streets and gravel on streets adjacent to the wakin saw-mill.

He stated that other streets needed gravel and that there were several culverts to install, but that there was not enough money available; suggested that money could be borrowed from other funds.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the streets already graded should be graveled, using up to 700 yards of gravel, the cost of which to be met by the transfer of necessary money from other funds.

Mayor Vinyard then announced that he had a conference with Mr. C.E. Stewart, District Supt. of the Federal Works Agency relative to surveying and engineering work for proposed public improvements; it appearing that under certain conditions, the Federal Govt. would advance the cost of such work for any city of political sub-division, the same to be returned when and if it was voted or otherwise decided to proceed with the improvements as outlined.

Mayor Vinyard also stated that it was his understanding that if, for any good legitimate reason, it should be deemed advisable not to proceed with the undertaking, no cost would accrue to the City or other public district, as the case might be.

It was then suggested that Mr. Stewart be invited to meet with the Council and give a more thorough explanation of the above mentioned matter, the Mayor signifying his willingness to extend the invitation.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
