Regular Monthly Meeting londay, Octo. 7-1946

The Regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, October 7 and called to order at 8.15 by President of Council, Geo. Koehler, in the absence of Mayor Vinyard.

Those present and answering roll call-Attorney Zimmerman, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Evans, Supt. Lent and Councilmen Berg, Cutsforth, Koehler, Kraft, Porter, and Reynolds. The minutes of the previous meeting of Sept. 3 were read and

approved.

City Treasurer Mangus then presented and read his various reports covering the quarter ending Sept. 30, the same being accepted subject to audit by the Finance Com.

Communications.

The Recorder then read a communication from F.M.Garmire, in which he stated that he had been working for the City about a year and felt that he was entitled to an increase in wages of \$ 25.00 per month.

In considering this matter, it was moved by Berg and seconded by Cutsforth that Lent, Garmire and Kendall should be raised \$ 25.00 per

month. This was lost, only two voting.

Whereupon it was moved by Porter, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the matter be left to a special meeting of the Council to be held before the next regular meeting.

October 7-continued

A report of the proceedings of the Caucus ... eting of Oct. 1

signed by Glen Cutsforthm-Secy. was then read by the Recorder.

This meeting was for the purpose of nominating a wayor, Treasurer and five councilmen and the results were as follows:

> -- Two year term - Craig Dedman For Mayor -Roy Mangus For Treasurer Do Do - Albert Berg For Councilman Four yearterm -Glen Makin, Rex Eversole, Geo. Berg and Neal Thompson

Elected to serve as a Caucus committee for the ensuing two years were -A.S.Markee, Chairman-C.E.Johnson and E.J.Mitchell.

It then appearing that a mutual understanding had been arrived at between the melephone Co. and the City relative to pole contacts and that an agreement had been drawn up by the City Attorney, on motion of Porter, seconded by Reynolds and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were authorized to signsame and that it become a part of these minutes.

The Council then took under consideration the Local Option Petition recently presented to the Recorder requesting that it be

placed on the ballot at the coming election.

It appearing that there were numerous irregularities in the petition, as pointed out by the County Clerk and leaving loopholes to be taken advantage of by those opposing the measure, on motion of Porter seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted not to place same on the ballot forms.

The Light Committee then reported having met with Mr. Beck relative to lighting the athletic field for night games and that such arrangements had been made, details of which would be embodied in a contract now being drawn up for acceptance by the City and Directors of Union High School District No. 1.

Mr. Koehler reported on street work and stated that he had used 372 yards of gravel in different sections of the City.

A deed from Mary Atkins to the City, conveying a strip to be used for road purposes was then accepted and ordered placed

on the records.
No Nother business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
