

Special Meeting
Monday, Oct. 28-1946

A special meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, Oct. 28, 1946 and called to order about 8.15 P.M.
Present, Mayor Vinyard, Councilmen Stefani, Porter, Cutsforth, Krueger, Koehler and Berg.

Roy Mangus acted as Recorder in absence of H.B. Evans.

Mayor Vinyard announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of taking some action in the matter of increase of wages for city employees, in accordance with motion carried at the last regular meeting.

It was moved by Koehler, seconded by Stefani and carried, that the salary of Supt. Lent be increased \$ 50.00 per month, to be charged equally between the Light Dept. and the Water Dept.

It was then moved by Krueger, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that the wages of Frank Kendall and F.M. Garmire be raised \$ 25 per month each and that the wages for part time labor be set at the rate of \$ 1.00 per hour.

Whereupon the Cemetery Committee was asked to check up on the rules and regulations governing the operation of the Cemetery and to report at the next regular meeting.

No other business appearing, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
