Regular Monthly Meeting Monds Dec. 2, 1946

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, December 2 and called to order at about 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Kendall, Supt. Lent, the City Recorder and Councilmen: Cutsforth, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Absent-Berg.

The minutes of the previous meeting of November 4 and those of the

special meeting of November 6 were read and approved.

Communications

The Recorder read a letter from Curtiss M. Everts, Jr. Secretary of the Oregon State Sanitary Authority in which he expressed apppreciation of courtesies extended him by the Council during the discussion of matters relating to the construction of a sewer system.

Mr. Everts also stated that his office would be glad to extend any further assistance in the matter, at any time.

A communication was also received from Ralph Milln of the County Surveyor's office relative to the placing of sidewalk grade stakes for Mr. Beck at the S.E. corner of 6th. and Grant sts.

Whereupon, Mr. Milln being present, he produced maps showing the Baker and Oliver plats and it was moved, seconded and carried, that the same be accepted when deed should be delivered allowing for ex-

tension of 6th. St. Mr. Milln also reported that there had never been a dedication of the street in front of the High School and that the records show only a 16 foot street there. This matter was left with him to prepare a deed and contact the school board and Mrs. Wm. Knight, owners of adjacent property.

Whereupon , Mr. car Davis submitted an application to the Council, for permission to operate a taxi-cab service and presented an agreement to be signed by both parties interested, if the members deemed it advisable.

On motion, seconded and carried, the contract was ordered signed, giving Mr. Davis the privilege of starting his service, but subject to passing of necessary ordinance later, granting him a license for three years from the final passage of the ordinance and a yearly fee of \$ 5.00.

Whereupon, Mr. A.L.Beck of the Canby Recreational Committee,

being present, asked that any money left at the close of the y-ear in the City Park funds be allocated to them. Mayor Vinyard sug-

gested that this matter be left to the incoming council.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported that the Canby Lumber Company operating the sawmill on the west side of town had been succeeded by the Wilkinson Lumber Co. and was calling for more power.

Also that a larger transformer had been installed across from

the telephone building and that more transformers were badly needed.

He also stated that the 68th dwelling this year had just been connected up for water service, as well as 15 business houses.

Mr. Koehler reported that on Dec. first there was still left in the road fund, the sum of \$56.00, with some more due from the County and that therefore it would not be necessary to borrow from other funds this year.. He also submitted map showing work done during 1946.

Whereupon, on motion, seconded and carried, the license of

the canby Auto Wreckers was approved for another year.

Mayor Vinyard then appointed a committee composed of Messrs. Koehler, Porter and Mangus to meet with Ralph Milln relative to sewerage matter.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
